TRAGIC DEATH IN SMUTSVILLE

The community of 'Die Onderste Gaatjie' went into mourning on Saturday 13 August when a three year old toddler was killed in a tragic accident.



MJ 'Junior', son of Mac Williams and Fiona Fourie, died mid afternoon after being accidentally struck by a vehicle as he crossed the road to visit his grandmother, Sara Fourie, who lives opposite his family's home.

SAPS and the ambulance were called to the scene, but it was clear that the young boy had died of his injuries. Community members complained that whilst a SAPS member remained there for the duration, the lengthy wait for the Forensics Team (the only ones who can permit the body to be moved from the road) was traumatic for the family.

At the time of the accident the family was already dealing with trauma as earlier in the

afternoon the boy's two year old brother Tino had sustained a broken leg after slipping off a dog kennel he was climbing on.

Junior's mother is currently in hospital with Tino, whilst his grandmother Sarah assists his father in looking after their third child Titan.

The family described Junior as an energetic and playful boy.

"That one he really liked music!" said his gran.

The funeral will be held 8.00am on Saturday 27 August at 131 Salie Street, Smutsville.

MAN SIGNS HIS OWN FREEDOM AWAY!

A man who burgled his employer's house on The Island and left a threatening note was obviously so impressed with his work that he signed it. This eventually led to his undoing.

On Saturday 20 August Johan Lombard was at home on Lorraine Street, The Island, having lunch with his family. He hadn't been inside long when he realised he had left his wallet in his bakkie which had been parked around the back of his house. When he went outside he found the wallet was lying open on the floor of his vehicle. All the cash was gone.

"Whoever took it must have known to walk around the whole house to find the vehicle," he later reasoned.

The next day he and his wife and two young children spent the afternoon canoeing on Swartvlei. On their arrival home at about 5.45pm, he heard the noise of gushing water from the toilet attached to his garage. He went to investigate and saw the top of the cistern had been crushed - it seemed obvious that someone had climbed on hit as there were foot marks on the wall behind.

"The water was gushing out, but hadn't pooled on the floor yet," said Lombard "So I realised that whatever had happened, it must have happened only seconds earlier."

He shouted to his wife, Karen, to call the police. She did this, asking the SAPS member to please hurry because the intruder may well still be in the nearby vicinity.

SAPS did not arrive at that stage and, after checking the garden, Johan took a drive around the neighborhood to see if any suspicious characters were lurking around.

He came across an ADT vehicle and told the driver the story. He was then given the number of a Neighborhood Watch member whom he called when he got back home. Whilst he had been driving, Karen had discovered that most of their electronic goods had been stolen.

Minutes after the call to the neighbourhood watch the whole place was buzzing with people. SAPS also arrived after a further call - and Johan later learned that the delay had been because a message hadn't been passed on between the outgoing and incoming shifts.

"Once they were there they were exceptionally professional," he said, "I was quite impressed."

He went to work the following day and noticed that one of his staff members was absent. It was that evening, whilst sitting at his PC, that Johan found a chilling message scrawled on a piece of scrap paper on his desk.

"I want to kill you." it read - with a signature next to it.

After staring at the horrifying note for a while, Johan started looking closely at the signature, thinking it was a little familiar. On a hunch he looked through his work receipts for places where his staff had signed and that's where he found a match!

According to Johan it was the same staff member who had missed work that day.

The next morning, after

sleuthing around and asking questions, he learned of someone who claimed he had seen the man with a tablet, with a picture of a Lombard family member on it.

He rushed to the police station and shared this new information, only to get the surprise of his life a few minutes later, when the suspect himself walked in. He claimed that he had been looking for Johan to apologise for being late, and had been told his boss was at the station.

Sensing what was happening by Johan's reaction, the Warrant Officer called the suspect over and informed him that he was a suspect. He later told Johan that he had asked him to write down the same threatening phrase and sign it - and this was another match!

Johan continued his investigation, tracing the suspect's movements, and eventually found a home where a lot of his stolen goods had been stored. He also found several witnesses to the fact that the man had been seen with the stolen property. After returning to the station with this information, a detective went back with him to take statements from these witnesses.

Armed with all this information, they returned again to the station to fetch the suspect, and, after handcuffing him, asked him to take them to his home where more of the stolen property was recovered.

The investigation is still ongoing, but there's no doubt that the next time this suspect uses his signature will be on his bail application.

Meet Greater Knysna's new Council

The final official results of the most recent Local Government Elections, from the Independent Electoral Commission (IEC), gave the DA 10 out of the 21 available seats in Council. The ANC received 7, Cope, the ACDP and the Knysna Unity Congress received one and the last remaining seat went to Independent Councillor, Velile Waxa.

Executive Mayor, Eleanore Bouw-Spies is the executive and political leader, as well as the social and ceremonial head, of the Knysna Municipality. She is the Ward 5 Councillor for the Democratic Alliance (DA).

She was born and raised in Knysna, attending the Rheenendal Primary School and later the Knysna Secondary School before attaining a BA Degree and a Higher Diploma in Education from the University of the Western Cape.

Eleanore has more than 16 years of political experience. She started her career as a public representative on the Knysna Council in 2000. She quickly moved up the ranks and become a member of the mayoral committee, moving to become deputy mayor and eventually the Executive Mayor of Knysna from 2007 – 2011.

During 2011, she retired from politics for three years, during which time she served as a Hospice Board Director and Honorary Rotarian. She busied herself with numerous community projects over the years, many of which focused on sports development and education.

Following the sad death of the Ward 5 Councillor, Magda Williams, Eleanore was approached and asked to consider standing as the DA Ward 5 candidate during the ensuing bi-election. She won the elections and re-entered the political arena serving as the Ward 5 Councillor. As this ward's councillor, she concentrated on alleviating the many problems that her community faced as a result of extreme poverty, drug and alcohol abuse and inadequate services.

While serving as the Ward 5 councillor she was also appointed as Speaker of the Council.

Having served as Ward 5 councillor and now mayor for the second time, she is described by colleagues as a "force of nature", and is adamant that under her watch the Knysna Municipality will continue to protect the South African Constitution and continue to provide clean and effective governance, promoting freedom, fairness, and opportunity for all.

NEW COUNCIL ANNOUNCED

With a coalition agreement with Ward 4 Independent Councillor Velile Waxa, the Democratic Alliance (DA) has once again secured control of the Greater Knysna Municipality. This was made public at the inaugural Council Meeting held at Council Chambers on Monday 15 August 2016.

Good news for Sedgefield is that both the village's ward Councillors – Levael Davis (Ward 1) and Cathy Weideman (Ward 2) have been elected to the 5 strong Mayoral Commission (MAYCO) – Davies holding the Technical Services portfolio and Weideman that of Community Services. Serving with them on the committee will be Executive Mayor – Eleanore Bouw-Spies, Deputy Executive Mayor and Chairperson of Finance, Governance & Economic Development Peter Myers, and Velile Waxa who will hold the Planning & Integrated Human Settlements portfolio.

During the recent Local Government Elections the DA won six out of the 11 wards situated within Greater Knysna. The final official results from the Independent Electoral

Commission (IEC) gave the DA 10 out of the 21 available seats in Council. Cope received one, as did the ACDP and the Knysna Unity Congress and the last remaining seat went to Independent Councillor Waxa. After several meetings the DA entered into the coalition agreement with stalwart Waxa – resulting in the DA now officially being the party that will govern Knysna for the next five years.

“We already have an approved budget in place to ensure that we can fulfill all we promised within our Election Campaign Manifesto,” said Mayor Bouw-Spies

She further gave the undertaking that the DA will continue to work hard to foster growth and delivery within Greater Knysna. “We will now continue our work towards a better future for all residents by delivering excellent services and achieving reconciliation through redress.”

She adds that that economic growth within Greater Knysna remains one of the priorities. “When we have economic growth in Greater Knysna it creates job opportunities, this is why it is so important to continue to grow Knysna as a centre for business.”

According to Bouw-Spies the DA council also undertakes to stop corruption by increasing resident's awareness of their anti-corruption hotline and anti-fraud policy. The DA has already taken steps to tighten up their Supply Chain Policy to comply fully with the relevant legislation.

In closing Bouw-Spies welcomed all to council and said that she is excited about the upcoming five years. “I welcome our opposition and look forward to vigorous debates. We are not scared of the opposition and know that through them Greater Knysna will experience a completely transparent Local Government, one that bides by legislature and one that is free of corruption.”

HABITUAL CRIMINAL CAUGHT RED HANDED

On Wednesday, 10 August at about 14:20 the police arrested a 28-year-old suspect on the Main Street of Sedgefield, for possession of suspected stolen property. This was done with assistance from local security personnel.



He was arrested after bedding and perishable goods were found in his possession, items which were later linked to a burglary reported at Charles te Water Street, on The Island. It is alleged that the suspect forced a window open to gain entrance to the house.

This suspect appeared in the Knysna Magistrates court on Friday 12 and Tuesday 16 August. He faced charges of housebreaking and theft as well as possession of suspected stolen property.

It has since been ascertained that this suspect was one Donald Tamboer, a very well known repeat offender who has appeared in this newspaper on at least two occasions. He had been released back onto our streets a few weeks ago, due to one of the many cases against him being struck off the court roll.

According to Mike Hofhuis of Community Orientated Policing (COP) this particular individual has plagued local home owners for a few years now. His usual

black refuse bags on either side of his bicycle. The radios got buzzing and several COP members and ADT officers responded.

Hofhuis said that when Tamboer entered the Main Road, it seemed he realized that the game was up, and stopped, dropping the bags onto the ground. The contents spilled out, and it became obvious he had been up to no good. Fortunately S A P S crime

prevention unit was already en route to assist and took charge of the matter immediately upon arrival.

Tamboer's luck didn't get any better. Whilst he was at the police station being questioned, a holiday resident from a recently burgled house on the Island walked in to open a case of burglary. The goods he described as having been stolen were the same as those found on the suspect.

A few days later a petition opposing bail was signed by 100 residents and presented in court at Tamboer's bail hearing.

"We are cautiously optimistic that this time, the prosecutors and magistrates handling these cases, will see fit to put this habitual criminal behind bars for more than just four or five months," said Hofhuis.

targets are unoccupied holiday homes with no burglar alarm systems, though this is not always the case.

"Sometimes his stay in a particular house can last a few days without detection from neighbours," said Hofhuis, "In one case some three years ago, the damage he caused to a house in Duiwe Laan was estimated at R40000."

Following Tamboer's release there was a noticeable increase in burglary of holiday homes, and COP and its crime-fighting partners were convinced Tamboer was the culprit. However, it seemed they could not catch him in the act, or positively link him to any of the crimes.

Then on Wednesday 10 August at approximately 2.00pm, a COP member saw Tamboer riding off The Island with two very large

SKILLS DEVELOPMENT THROUGH WOOD

This year the Working with Wood Show, held in association with the Association of Woodturners South Africa (AWSA), is to be held at the Nelson Mandela Metropolitan University (NMMU) George Campus from August 26 to 28. The focus of this event lies in the upliftment of surrounding communities through woodworking.

Besides the myriad of wood and timber related products, skills and machinery on display, the event's main aim is to reawaken interest in carpentry and place wood firmly back on the centre stage where it once lived.

With this in mind, the American Association of Woodturners' (AAW) board, on invitation of AWSA, will launch two of their outreach initiatives, Turners without Borders (TWB) and Women in Turning (WIT), during this festival of wood.

The key to the success of a TWB initiative is to locate the project in a community where there is an existing support base. Based on the global experience, it has been decided to establish the first South African pilot project for TWB in the Garden Route.

The pilot sites identified are in the Karatara district, in partnership with Tsiba (Tertiary School in Business Administration), and in George, together with the NMMU campus, in partnership with the School of Natural Resource Management (wood technology)

In full support of this initiative, Garden Route-based experienced woodturners have agreed to provide mentoring to members of the community throughout their journey towards acquiring woodturning skills.

AAW, the largest woodturning organisation in the world, launched their TWB three years ago. Through this they have already established many fascinating initiatives. They have successfully transferred woodturning skills to deprived communities in several countries such as Mexico, Puerto Rico, China and India.

Through their newly acquired skills in woodturning and making use of the local supply of wood, members of these deprived communities have been able to develop local economies and in so doing have been able to uplift themselves.

Last year, the AAW agreed to bring the TWB programme to South Africa and have committed to sponsoring Carmen de la Paz, an international DIY icon, to South Africa to launch the TWB initiative. In agreeing to come and support this initiative, the AAW further agreed to look at a partnering model with the AWSA.

In parallel with the TWB project, AWSA will be launching the Women in Turning (WIT) project in recognition that globally, women are in the top rankings of woodturners. A move away from the traditional male-domination has been noticed, with women making their mark in the industry and many of them finding a new meaning for themselves. Among

other drivers, the WIT project will be designed to generate income to expand the TWB project to other regions in South Africa.

Because of De la Paz' passion and commitment to the development of those less fortunate, she has committed both her time and personal funds to the launch of this project in South Africa during the Working with Wood Show.

The AWSA symposium will run throughout the Working with Wood Show. There are still a few seats available for this symposium, where woodturners will be taught numerous and various woodturning techniques.

Besides the many woodturning lectures, the Working with Wood team are offering three days of woodworking demonstrations and workshops at no charge.

BURNT HOMES REPLACED

Huge Kudos to Knysna Municipality for their efforts in making a few broken lives better.

After the 27 July runaway blaze in Beverly Hills, Smutsville razed 17 homes to the ground and damaged three more beyond repair, the local authority joined the community in coming to the fore to assist the affected families.

On Tuesday 16 August, a team of contractors from Artcon Construction arrived at the disaster site to commence construction of twenty new 'Wendy houses'. The two room homes are 6m x 3m structures with pine walls and floors and corrugated iron roofs. They are supported by concrete blocks and have communal ablution blocks built nearby.

HPV VACCINATION AWARENESS

In these modern times with the advances in medicine we are privileged to be able to protect the next generation from diseases that have caused many fatalities in previous generations.

Most recently the Human papillomavirus, which is a sexually transmitted disease, has a vaccine that has been developed to prevent this STD that causes genital warts and changes in the cervix that can result in cervical cancer, and other cancers in other areas, such as the penis, anus and throat. Recent research suggests it may even be linked to cardiovascular disease in women.

Prevention is better than cure and it is recommended for girls and boys 11 or 12 years old, as well as for older kids who are unvaccinated. This series should be started at age 9 for children who have been sexually abused. A vaccine is an important step in preventing infection and protecting against the spread of HPV. It works best when given before someone becomes sexually active.

The risks are minimal and far out weigh the symptoms and full blown disease of HPV. Side effects, of the vaccination, are

usually mild fever and tenderness, swelling, and redness at the site of the injection. Dizziness, fainting, nausea, and vomiting also may occur after the shot. Allergic reactions to the vaccine are rare.


As the old adage goes, it's better to be safe than sorry. The vaccine is recommended by The World Health Organisation (WHO) as part of routine vaccinations in countries that can afford them, along with other prevention measures. The vaccines require two or three doses depending on how old the person is. Vaccinating girls around the ages of nine to thirteen is typically recommended.

The vaccines provide protection for at least eight years. Vaccinating a large portion of the population may also benefit the unvaccinated. Sadly the vaccine does not help in those bodies already infected with HPV.



The first HPV vaccine became available in 2006. As of 2014, 58 countries, including South Africa, include it in their routine vaccinations, at least for girls. The vaccine is on the World Health Organisation Essential Medicines List, the most important medication recommended for a basic health system.
