PetroSA will also be open on Saturday to accommodate the backlog of

Meanwhile, our enquiry to Knysna Municipality garnered the following response from Randall Bower, their Manager of Waste Management.

"The fire at PetroSA impacted all the municipalities along the Garden Route. Knysna Municipality has not been spared, and, as a result, the Municipality had to store excess waste at the waste transfer station in Knysna and the recycling centre in Sedgefield. Whilst we were permitted to offload earlier today, the problem has not yet been averted. The delays at PetroSA again highlight the importance of waste minimisation. We can all play our part by reducing the waste we generate at home and the office.'

But the Barrington man's biggest beef is the various authorities' 'radio silence' about a matter that clearly could have a huge impact on local communities.

"The info dissemination is nonexistent," he said. "One would think that at least some waste skips could be placed at the

plastic. Or, at minimum, a newsflash email could be sent to all Greater Knysna area residents informing them of the status quo and how they could assist."

Sedgefield Ratepayers and Residents Association Chair Lileth Seals also weighed in.

"The overfull refuse dump on the North side of the N2 - the entrance to Sedgefield - is in a terrible state," she stated, "And it is obviously not coping with the waste generated by the town. Once again, we will contact the Director of Technical Services, asking for an explanation and, more importantly, how we, the residents of Sedgefield, can assist in managing the waste. It has been suggested that residents keep their rubbish until the matter is sorted, but this is a problem to be managed by the Knysna Municipality. It has been an ongoing problem for many years, and often it seems as if it is only sorted out before the visitors arrive in December. We need a permanent long-term solution. We need the Municipality to take a more active interest in the basic needs of Sedgefield."



Sedgefield's social media pages were abuzz with horrific speculation last week after news broke of a human body being found behind a business centre on Wednesday, 16 November. Fortunately, SAPS has reported that they have successfully identified the deceased, and no foul play is suspected.

The man has been identified as Pieter Koopman, a 53-year-old homeless person who they believe died of natural causes. His family is from Rheenendal. A post-mortem to determine the cause of death has been conducted, and the results will be shared with his

His body was discovered at approximately 9 am by Christo Pieterse, soon after he and his wife Petricia arrived at her business 'The Art Hub', next to Sotheby's on Swallow Drive. The couple had picked up a rather noxious odour and thought that perhaps a rodent had died nearby. Christo went to investigate and followed the smell to a walled-off space behind the building.

The space had been created for the storage of black bags etc. but had not been used. Indeed, it was recently closed off at the side when it was discovered that vagrants had been going in and out, often leaving drink bottles and other detritus behind.

But the top was still open, and when Christo peered over the wall into the storage area, he made the horrific discovery of Mr Koopman's decomposing body lying across the floor. There were also some old clothes and a few bottles.

It is not known exactly how long the body had been there, except that the area had been cleaned out the previous Wednesday.

The shell-shocked couple called Sedgefield's Community Orientated Policing, who in turn alerted SAPS and Forensics soon had the building cordoned off.

"They took a very long time going over the entire scene before they finally removed the body," said

Over the next few days, whilst the shop owners ensured the storage area was scrubbed as clean as

possible, speculation ran wild on social media sites until eventually Councillor Cleone Vanstone, who also chairs an NPO assisting the homeless, requested that locals 'be mindful not to spread untrue, non-factual stories and stay calm until we have the facts.'

Petricia says that she and Cleone have had several conversations over the last week, and one positive that has come from the sad demise of Mr Koopman is that Cleone and COP are compiling a database of all Sedgefield's homeless and street people. This will include each person's photograph, ID number, family information where available and anything else that will assist in cases such as this in the future.

Meanwhile, Cleone has informed us that she is currently waiting for feedback from SANRal regarding the possibility of acquiring land for a 'safe space' for the homeless.

DOG ATTACK

When Craig McWilliams set off with his dog, Rocket, for an evening walk on Friday, 11 November, he certainly had no idea what trauma lay before

Walking along the road to Cloud 9 at about 5 pm, he came across a group of teens walking near the cleared area with six unleashed dogs, and before he knew it, his dog was under a vicious attack.

His one-year-old Doberman was on a lead and totally overwhelmed by the pack, which included two Pit Bulls. Craig sprang to his dog's rescue, losing his glasses in the ensuing fray and getting bitten himself. When the largest Pit Bull bit into Rocket's face and the other dogs latched onto his legs and tail, Craig's desperation to save his suffering companion grew tenfold, and all he could do was punch the biggest attacking dog over and over until it let go. Unfortunately, he damaged his hand quite severely in the process.

He screamed for help during the whole incident, and fortunately,

way home heard him and quickly drove to the scene. The boys ran off, their dogs following. The vehicle driver immediately notified his security company, and they apprehended the fleeing boys just

as they reached the stairs going over the dune.

What really incensed Craig was the attitude of the young dog owners, who he estimated were around the age of 13.

"They did nothing to stop the fight – they didn't seem to care at all," he told us later.

After quickly walking his dog home, Craig drove to the spot where the security personnel and a member of COP were watching over the teens.

'We waited for the police to arrive until it got dark," said Craig, "But eventually, the boys He explained that the

security company members had been understandably hesitant to detain the juveniles for any length

He said that the police arrived at his home later but intimated that without the boys' names (which they had refused to give), they couldn't really do anything.

A newcomer to Sedgefield, Craig said he had moved to the area for a quiet life. He had regularly walked Rocket on the Cloud 9 route for two months, but no longer. He says the young Doberman was clearly traumatised and is still very nervous about going out.

"I often see older folks walking their dogs and wonder about the terrible consequences should they get attacked the same way!" he said.

BODY FOUND NEAR

SAPS Knysna has opened an inquest docket after a body was retrieved from the water at Kassat se Drift near Rheenendal on Monday, 21 November 2022.

Says Sergeant Christopher Spies of the WC SAPS Media Centre, "Information available indicates that a couple noticed the body floating in the water and alerted authorities. Police diving unit members later retrieved the decomposed body of a man. The deceased is yet to be identified."

The body was reportedly dressed in Adidas tracksuit pants, a checked shirt and blue Nike tekkies.

Sergeant Godfrey Jantjies, the investigating officer, urges the public to come forward with any information which might assist the police in tracing the next of kin of the deceased.

"Anyone with information can contact Knysna Detectives on 044 302 6652," says Spies.

The investigation continues.

Report suspected fraud and corruption

Knysna Municipality encourages members of the public, external stakeholders and employees to report allegations of fraud and corruption. Acting Municipal Manager Roland Butler explained that such reports can be made anonymously and that there are laws in place to protect the rights of whistle-blowers.

The Knysna Municipality channel on the Collaborator (Collab) Citizen app now features an independent antifraud and corruption portal, making it even easier to report suspicions of criminal activity. "The Internal Audit Section will receive any allegation through the app directly," said Butler. "This is an independent assurance unit that will treat all information with sensitivity. They will follow up on all claims and ensure that guilty parties are dealt with accordingly."

Suspected crimes that must be reported include not only fraud and corruption but instances of financial misconduct, waste of resources, misuse of municipal assets, sabotage, danger to public health or safety, sexual exploitation and abuse and serious malpractice.

"The most obvious example of corruption is the acceptance of bribes," he said. "Never offer a traffic, police or law enforcement officer a bribe if you have committed an offence, and report them if they request a bribe to ignore the matter. It is also illegal to 'buy' your driving licence or to be in the possession of a fake licence."

"No employee of Knysna Municipality or members of their family may accept a favour, gift or reward in return for services rendered or the awarding of a contract or tender," he continued. "This includes gifts of cash, liquor, meals, or any form of sponsorship.

"Our Supply Chain Management officials act with integrity, and our systems and policies are implemented fairly and in accordance with the law," said Butler. "Nonetheless, we urge anyone who suspects any irregularities regarding any contract being awarded to report the matter immediately. This includes suspicions involving any bidder or applicant who may be abusing the SCM system in any way."

You may not impersonate a prospective beneficiary, forge

their signature or jump the queue on the housing lists. Nor may you occupy a home illegally or sublet your RDP home without permission."

"Corruption is a crime that we must fight together," Butler concluded. "If you suspect a case of fraud or maladministration, please report it immediately. It is only through working together that we can stop crime, build mutual trust and create an inclusive, innovative, inspired Knysna."

Knysna Municipality supports International Fraud Awareness Week, a global awareness campaign that runs from 13 to 19 November.

the state of the environment to make their voices heard and intensify the environmental debate in order to ensure that sustainability and resilience of natural resources remain top of the regional agenda."

CHECK THE VALUE OF YOUR HOME

This week the Knysna Municipality has begun notifying ratepayers of the new Valuation Roll, valid for the next five years from 2023 to 2028. This is the value that the Municipality places on your property in order to levy rates that are collected monthly or annually to ensure income for their expenditure. Rates will be based on this valuation.

The Valuation Roll is available on the website knysna.gov.za (type 'Knysna Full GV in the search tab) and can be accessed by anyone interested. Please note: - It is a document of more than 450 pages, and Sedgefield erwen are listed from page 405.

Says Lileth Seals, Chair of Sedgefield Ratepayers & Residents Association, "If you have any objection to the valuation, there is a form to be completed and sent to a given address before 30 January 2023. If you need help accessing or submitting the form, please do not hesitate to contact us for help or advice. Remember that this valuation is set for the next five years, so any objection should be submitted soonest." The association's email address is sedgefield.ratepayers@gmail.com.

What is the Municipal Property Rates Act? (Act 6 of 2004)

The Municipal Property Rates Act is a national law that regulates the power of municipalities to value and rate immovable properties (that is, land and buildings).

Important concepts

- Market Value: The amount a property would have realised if sold on the date of valuation (Act 6 of 2004 Section 1).
- Date of valuation: The date upon which the market value of your property is assessed (Act 6 of 2004
- The date of implementation: The date on which the municipality will implement their valuation roll (Act 6 of 2004 Section 32).

How property rates are calculated (Act 6 of 2004 Section 11)

The amount payable is calculated by multiplying the market value of the property by a cent amount in the rand that a municipal council determines. The tariff is determined by the municipality in terms of its tariff

Differential rating (Act 6 of 2004 Section 8) Municipalities may levy different tariffs for different categories of rateable property. The categories must be determined in the rates policy. Categories may include the following:

- Residential properties
- Industrial properties
- Business and commercial properties
- Agricultural properties
- Public service infrastructure State-owned properties

Impermissible rates (Act 6 of 2004 Section 17)

- Municipalities may not levy rates on certain
- As a homeowner, you should note that the first R15

- 000.00 of the market value of a property used for residential purposes is excluded from the rateable value
- The first 30% of the market value of public service infrastructure is also an impermissible rate. Preparation of a Valuation Roll (Act 6 of 2004 Section 30) Each municipality must prepare a Valuation Roll of the properties within their jurisdiction. Municipal Valuers must be appointed to determine the market value of all immovable properties. Municipal Valuer (Act 6 of 2004 Section

Professional Valuers will ensure that properties are valued fairly and objectively. These professionals must be registered as Valuers in terms of the Property Valuers Profession Act, No 47 of 2000.

Data collection (Act 6 of 2004 Section 41)

Data collectors employed by the Municipal Valuer must carry an identity card and may only visit your property between 07h00 and 19h00, Mondays to Saturdays, not on Sundays or public holidays.

Rates policy (Act 6 of 2004 Section 5)

- · A Municipality must prepare a rates policy to be reviewed annually.
- The rates policy must treat all persons liable for paying rates equitably. • The Act makes specific references to the effect of rates on the poor, public benefit organisations, and public service infrastructure and should allow the municipality to promote local, social, and economic development within the municipality.

Preparation of the rates policy (Act 6 of 2004 Section 50)

- Once a draft rates policy has been approved the municipality must advise the public availability of the draft rates policy and call for public comment.
- A prescribed period of 30 days is the window of opportunity for ratepayers to consider the draft rates policy and make comments. All comments must be considered by the municipality.

Public inspection of the Valuation (Act 6 of 2004 Section 49)

- The municipality must advertise inviting the ratepayers to inspect the Valuation Roll.
- In addition, the municipality must post, by ordinary mail, an extract of the Valuation Roll to every property owner, together with a notice advising them of the objection process.

How to lodge an objection (Act 6 of 2004 Section

- Should a property owner disagree with the market value of his/her property as reflected in the valuation roll, the property owner should approach the municipal manager to lodge an objection citing reasons for the objection
- There is a 30-day period for this activity. The Act requires that the objector continue paying rates while his/her objections are being processed and finalised.

The right to appeal (Act 6 of 2004 Section 54)

- If the objector is still not satisfied with the outcome of an objection decision, he has the right to lodge an application with the Valuation Appeal Board.
- The MEC within the Province has the responsibility to establish a Valuation Appeal Board.
- The Valuation Appeal Board will consider each individual case and make a ruling based on the merits of the case.

EVACUATION PLAN MEETING IN SEDGE RE/MAX

Submitting a return on time and making timeous payments is an important part of a taxpayer's

To promote adherence to deadlines, SARS notifies taxpayers of the due date for payments. If the taxpayers fail to pay, then the cases will be referred to our Enforcement Division for debt collection.

DEADLINE, PAYMENTS & PENALTIES

This year, filing season for nonprovisional taxpayers (Individual and Trusts) ended on 24 October.

When the 2022 filing season opened in July this year, SARS issued over three million auto assessments, which once again proved to be a helpful tool to increase filing compliance.

The enhanced auto-assessment process this year resulted in a dramatic decline in the number of physical queues and walk-ins at SARS branches.

By the 24 October 2022 deadline, individual and trusts submissions filed for 2022 and other tax years totalled 4.806 million. This is a whopping 11.8 % increase from 2021, with the majority of these returns having been received from auto-

Taxpayers who are unable to pay the full amount are encouraged to approach SARS for payment arrangements.

Disagreeing with your Assessment

A taxpayer who disagrees with an assessment has the right to lodge a dispute on reasonable grounds within 30 business days from the assessment being issued. Taxpayers can do this either via eFiling or at a SARS branch by appointment.

Payments can also be suspended on request via eFiling, provided that the necessary requirements are met.

Penalties for missing deadlines

Taxpayers who fail to submit and pay on or before the deadline will be charged administrative penalties for late or non-submission of the required tax return and interest for late payment. SARS will impose a fixed amount of penalties based on a taxpayer's taxable income, which can range from R250 up to R16 000 a month for each month that the

non-compliance continues. Whether you agree or disagree with the admin penalty, it is advisable to submit the outstanding return to stop further admin penalties. The penalty will reoccur for every month the return(s) remains outstanding for a maximum of 35 months. In the meantime, if taxpayers disagree with the admin penalty, they can submit a Request for Remission (RFR) via eFiling or at a SARS branch. The taxpayer must provide reasons for the non-compliance for the request to be considered. If the Request for Remission is disallowed or only a portion was selectively allowed, the taxpayer may still object to the decision made by SARS and even appeal the decision if they disagree with the outcome of the

objection process. Please refer to the Objections and Appeals page on the SARS website (www.sars.gov.za) for more information on how to submit a dispute in respect of an Admin Penalty.

Please note: With effect from 1 December 2022, administrative penalties relating to the late submission of a tax return will be charged when one or more tax return(s) relating to tax years from 2007 up to 2020 are outstanding. Prior to this change, taxpayers were only liable for administrative penalties for late submission if they had two or more tax returns outstanding for these tax years. For more information, see the Admin Penalty page on the SARS website.

On 11 November 1918 at 11;00, the guns fell silent, bringing to an end the First World War -Armistice Day. The bleak, devastating landscape became known as "No Man's Land", where bright red poppies began to grow in their thousands, flourishing even in

At the going down of the sun and in the morning We will remember them.

(Extract from the poem "For the Fallen" by Laurence Binyon)

Two minutes of silence was observed at precisely 11 a.m. as a tribute to the sacrifices the armed forces made to defend freedom

A lone Piper played a lament as M.O.T.H representatives and members of the public laid wreaths.

The atmosphere was pensive and reflective as the ceremony concluded.



Jennings says regularly measuring blood glucose is another important step in managing and preventing complications related to T2D.

"As with most diseases, early detection is crucial to prevent complications. Too many people are ignoring the obvious warning signs and may be setting themselves up for serious and debilitating illnesses down the

"Even if you don't suspect you have diabetes, rather have it tested annually. Tests can be done at your GP or pharmacy clinic. At-home devices, called blood glucose meters, can also be used. A normal blood glucose range (while fasting) should be within the range of 3.9 to 5.5 mmol/L. Anything higher could be a sign of pre-diabetes or diabetes.


