


all. (And it's a genuinely free gift - no credit card details or eft required, there's no queue at the till and you don't even have to stress that the courier finds you house!)

Knysna Municipality announced the implementation of Level 3 water restrictions on Friday, 2 December.

"Council has declared a local disaster in relation to the drought and load shedding. We must reduce our consumption immediately or face an intermittent supply of water," announced Acting Municipal Manager Roland Butler. "All areas are under severe strain. I appeal to all residents to reduce water consumption urgently and drastically.'

"We are carting water to Buffalo Bay and cannot keep up with demand. The Goukamma River is saline, and the water cannot be treated for human consumption. The Buffelskop reservoir level is extremely low due to increased and continuous demand, and load shedding and technical difficulties have hampered our efforts to fill this reservoir," Butler explained. "Trucks are delivering water to Sedgefield too. The water at the abstraction point in the Karatara River is also saline as the river is not flowing, and our water sources are producing less potable water than the current demand. The higher zones of Dam se Bos and Upper Old place were left without water on Monday, 12 December, and we are also trucking water to these areas.

"The approximate historical rainfall figure for the greater Knysna area during November is 85mm. This figure plummeted to only 2mm this year," he continued. "We are dependent on our rivers for our water, but the unnaturally low rainfall received during November has had a dire effect on all our rivers. Those that have not stopped flowing yet are dangerously low. The increase in load shedding is also creating serious technical and infrastructure problems regarding water supply, and vandalism continues to disrupt services. We must all take this situation very seriously and use less water."

"Managing infrastructure issues related to load shedding and the drought is costing the Municipality a great deal of money. Council has had to drastically increase funding on drought and load shedding interventions," Butler explained. "The operating cost combined with the capital cost of implementing emergency schemes amounts to an

astronomical estimate of R11 420 690 per

month. Then one must also take practicalities into account, the scarcity of generators available for hire being just one example."

"Level three water restrictions must be adhered to by residents and visitors," he said. "We cannot tolerate any transgressions of these restrictions and will follow up on - and act against - any reports of water wastage.

Level 3 water restrictions dictate that:

- Municipal potable water is for human consumption only;
- No watering of gardens (not even with a
- No washing of vehicles and/or boats;
- All residents and businesses to restrict their usage to 20 Kl/month;
- Residents utilising more than the 20 Kl/month will be identified and notified to install water-restrictive devices:

A punitive tariff as prescribed by the 2022/2023 Medium Term Revenue and Expenditure Framework Tariff Book will now be implemented for Level 3. This means that an additional 100% of the approved water consumption tariff will be applied when consumption is more than 25kl per month (the increase will be applied to households and businesses that use 25kl or more per month).

"Please start using less water immediately," Butler concluded. "We cannot bulk up our water reserves if we are already trucking water to areas where demand is outweighing supply. This situation is affecting everyone, and we need everyone's cooperation in trying to mitigate this crisis."



OPENING OF THE ESTUARY MOUTH - WHEN IS THE RIGHT TIME?

Some like it open – some like it water body. closed... SANParks Senior Marine Ranger Jonathan Britton explains the open and shut case for breaching the Swartvlei Mouth.

When are they opening the mouth? This question is not uncommon and is frequently asked by Sedgefield locals and visitors alike over the summer holidays. Swartvlei is an estuarine system that is naturally intermittently open to the sea and thus has both open and closed phases. The state of the estuary (whether open or closed) depends on several factors, including rainfall in the catchment area and sea conditions near the estuary mouth. In the open phase, there is a tidal exchange of water between the estuary and the ocean.

Over time the deposition of marine sediments into the estuary mouth, brought about by marine waves and currents, becomes greater than the erosion of sediments resulting from the outflow of water, ultimately resulting in the estuary closing. During high sea conditions, seawater can wash over the sand berm into the estuary when it is closed, which is sometimes mistaken for the mouth being open. This is known as overtopping, and some fish species use these events to recruit into estuaries.

Personal interactions with the estuary often result in the perception of a "good open phase" and a "bad closed phase", which leads to the belief that the estuary mouth must be open every summer to ensure the estuary remains healthy. The open and closed phases of the estuary are ecologically different, and neither is 'better' or 'worse' than the other. They are just different natural states brought about by physical and ecological processes.

While the closed phase is often mistakenly believed to be bad, it is actually a very productive phase. A common misperception is that during a closed phase, the water is stagnant and lifeless. whereas, in fact, this is the period when bottom-dwelling algal populations begin to recover and build up. This algae forms an important component of the food web, providing nutrition for invertebrates that are, in turn, consumed by fish and birds. The stable conditions of a closed phase also promote the growth of submerged plants which, besides providing food for invertebrates, fish and birds, also afford shelter and protection for juvenile fish.

Dissolved oxygen is also typically higher during closed phases due to photosynthesis, which can contribute more to increased dissolved oxygen levels than physical movement/disturbance of the

Estuary ecosystems are complex, dynamic and diverse. To learn more about the ecology of the Swartvlei system residents and visitors are encouraged to search for the following article published on the internet, as it provides easy reading and excellent insight into estuarine ecology and management challenges.

"Review of the ecology and management of temporarily open/closed estuaries in South Africa, with particular emphasis on river flow and mouth state as primary drivers of these systems" African Journal of Marine Science August 2012 AK Whitfield et al.

Why not allow the estuary to breach naturally? Lowlying developments on the flood plains adjacent to Swartvlei are prone to flooding, and natural breaching processes cannot occur if we wish to protect this infrastructure. As a compromise to balance hydrological,

ecological, and social objectives, the Swartvlei Estuary mouth is artificially breached when water levels reach 2.0 m above mean sea level (amsl). This prescribed breaching height has been in place for several decades.

Typically the sand berm at the

estuary mouth rises to more than 3m amsl under natural conditions, which would be the approximate height at which Swartvlei Estuary would naturally breach under most circumstances. A breaching height of 2.0 amsl is already a significant compromise, and breaching at even lower levels would likely result in even earlier closure, further reduction in marine connectivity, and accelerated accumulation of marine sediments in the lower reaches of estuaries. These additional changes would not only detrimentally affect environmental functioning, including productivity and nursery function, of the estuary but also increase flood risks to adjacent communities (including Sedgefield) in the long term. It would be a case of short-term benefits for a few, at the expense of long-term losses for many, with further declines in overall estuary condition resulting in concomitant declines in the benefits society derive from Swartvlei.

The Garden Route has received significantly below-average rainfall since July 2022, and as a result, water restrictions have been implemented across the Garden Route District. The below-average rainfall cycle has resulted in the lower water levels

in Swartvlei currently observed. At the current water level, a significant rainfall episode of approximately 150 mm is required for water levels in Swartvlei to reach the 2.0 m amsl prescribed breaching height.

Premature breaching of the estuary will only be considered if there are serious unavoidable threats to public health if they come into contact with the water; urgent maintenance to critical infrastructure is required; heavy rainfall occurs in the catchment (to reduce the risk of flooding); or if several other ecological thresholds are met.

Managing flood risk without compromising long-term ecological functioning is a delicate balance, and several proactive actions are implemented to reduce the risk of flooding to low-lying properties. These include, but are not limited to: live real-time weather stations in the mountain catchment of Swartvlei that measure rainfall rate and quantity, which is used to estimate subsequent rise in water level in the estuary and timeously inform decision making; the construction of a preparatory breaching channel at the estuary mouth that significantly reduces the time required to open the mouth when necessary; regular monitoring of the height of the sand berm and water levels; and placing equipment on standby during severe weather warnings. Flood risk can be reduced but not eliminated, especially with climate change models predicting the likelihood of increased coastal flooding.

The Garden Route National Park has produced a State Of Knowledge Report, which is a compilation of information available from various published sources, and forms the scientific knowledge base on which the Garden Route National Park Management Plan and objectives for the management of estuaries, including Swartvlei Estuary, are based.



It is now a wellaccepted principle of urban design that public art contributes to a community's identity, fosters community pride and a sense of belonging, and enhances the quality of life for its residents and visitors.'

Like all good things, the Creatively Team of Sedgefield are made to go together, just like salt and pepper or waffles and ice cream. The two women transforming our town one piece of public art at a time are extreme individuals working together to make the world a better place.

This joint goal of Kayla and Lindie is what makes them a force to be reckoned with. Where one begins, the other one finishes. Their complementary art styles are a reflection of the way they work together and shine through in what they do. All the better to realise their dreams of enriching society through accessible public art. These murals that have sprung up around town, the 'Bee Kind' wall at 5 Swallow St, the SAMS Charity shop decorations and the 'Out Of This World' wall at

Studio 42, are just the tip of the iceberg when it comes to the plans these two artists have to uplift and inspire our community.

Lindie Calitz (30), previously employed in the Destination Marketing Tourism arena, had to quickly change tack in her career after the pandemic hit in 2020 and found herself exploring other avenues using her specialised skillset to generate a means of survival. Encountering Kayla Lee Handt (24) can only be described as divine intervention. These two devout Christian ladies were surely thrown together because of their common interest in being a part of the Greater Good. What an impact they have made!

Both were born into creative lifestyles; Kayla was raised in her mother's art studio, 'born with a paintbrush in her hand', so to speak. PLEASE BE AWARE OF RIP CURRENTS IN OUR AREA

Rip currents claim the lives of many people each year. They often move slowly enough to barely be detected, but given the right circumstances of waves and beach profile, they can develop into currents moving at speeds of up to two metres per second - faster than any of us can swim. Ranging in width from just a few meters to a hundred

meters, they pull to just behind Below is a description of how to where the waves form and then lose their power.

A rip current is not the same as a rip tide which is formed as the tide ebbs and flows through a narrow opening such as an estuary. The Knysna Heads are a great example of where you will find extremely dangerous rip

spot a rip and what to do when caught in one.

Rip currents can develop where there are breaking waves. Bigger waves produce stronger currents, and these "rivers" of current are produced by water moving from the beach back out to sea. They happen all the time at many beaches and are the biggest danger visitors face in the water.

As with all risks, avoiding rip currents altogether is the safest strategy. To do this, only swim at beaches where lifeguards are on duty and swim between their flags.

Although an untrained eye may struggle to see rip currents, stronger rip currents give telltale signs. With patience and careful observation, it is not hard to see that water in a channel or 'river' between breaking waves is moving away from the beach. The current may not flow straight out from the beach. It may flow at an angle or have a bend or two in it before it gets to the backline, where waves are forming

Here is what you should look

- Water through a surf zone that is a different colour from the surrounding water.
- A change in the incoming pattern of waves (often, the waves are not breaking in a rip channel).
- Seaweed, sand 'clouds' or debris moving out to the backline where waves are forming through the surf zone.
- Turbulent or choppy water in the surf zone in a channel or riverlike shape flowing away from the beach.
- The best resource to help you avoid rip currents are lifeguards. Swim only where lifeguards are on duty, and if they are not on duty, DO NOT swim.

Should avoidance fail and you

most important thing to remember is: DO NOT PANIC. Stay calm and force yourself to relax. You are not going to win a fight with the ocean. Swim slowly and conservatively out of the current or relax and let it carry you out past the breakers until it slacks.

Take note from looking at the beach of the direction that the current is pulling you, think of it like a river and remember to get out of a river you would swim to the river bank. This means that in a rip current, you should swim at 90 degrees to the direction you are being pulled and then use the

waves to help you get back to the beach.

Rip currents are not an "undertow."

A rip current will not pull you under the water. So long as you can float, you will be safe until you can escape it by swimming to the side (out of it) and then back to the beach. Be sure to maintain a slow and relaxed pace until you reach the shore or assistance arrives. If you are swimming at a beach where lifeguards are on duty - and you should not swim at beaches if lifeguards are not on duty - they will be able to help you. Raise your arm and wave for help.

If you see someone in a rip current: Do not go in to help unless you are trained and have emergency flotation such as the NSRI Pink Rescue Buoy or a surfboard. If you are not trained in water rescue, throw something that floats into the rip current, which will carry it out to the person in difficulty.

Unfortunately, at some beaches, this will not work, and the only option is to call for help. The Pink Rescue Buoy signs have emergency numbers for the closest NSRI station on them or simply Google 'Sea Rescue', which will give you the nearest Sea Rescue Station's emergency

ACCESS TO HEALTH, WELLNESS AND WELFARE SERVICES

Working from the Wellness Centre, on average, per month, the Community Health Workers visited 678 households and provided aherence support 179 times. They also assisted the counsellor with 230 VCTs (Voluntary Counselling and Testing for HIV) and TB Tests and with the distribution of chronic medication for the clinic.

HUG (House under Grace), the Masithandane Care and Respite Centre, provided 24/7 cost-effective, compassionate care by competent health care workers under the supervision of a professional registered nursing sister to those who were chronically or terminally ill, or who needed rehabilitative post-operative care.

Assistance in the form of general and trauma counselling and grant and ID applications was also given. Awareness campaigns and early intervention services were provided in collaboration with FAM SA, the Department of Social Services, SAPS and Knysna Alcohol and Drug Centre.



Five hundred meals per week were provided from the Masithandane Wellness Centre and at least 5700 meals per week from the 19 Community Kitchens situated in the Greater Knysna area, including Sedgefield, Karatara and Rheenendal. Assistance with parcels and meals included 14 weekly fresh-produce parcels for the immunechallenged and a minimum of 36 monthly food parcels. In addition all the children and older persons in the various programmes were provided with meals. Vegetable gardens were established with the help of Growing Upwards.

ACCESS TO IM PROVEM ENT AND EM POWERM ENT OPPORTUNITIES FOR THE WELL-BEING OF **CHILDREN**

Our Early Childhood Development Centre provided Pre-grade Rand Grade Rclasses for 32 childen.

Psycho-Social support was provided for 10 children needing grief and bereavement counselling each quarter.

Learn through programmes included knitting, craft and numeracy and literacy.

Child and Youth Care Workers reached out to at least 85 vulnerable families and 522 children.

Bursaries were provided for weekly transport for 32 children attending high schools in George and Knysna and daily transport was arranged to George for another 32 children.

A Learner Support Programme was initiated to support children from the Smutsville, Sizamile and Slangepark communities in Grades 7 and 8. For many of the Grade 8s, the transition from primary to high school is difficult and the risk of dropping out of school is great. To minimise this risk Seabridge School, Masithandane, and a Sedgefield Volunteer Teacher group worked together to provide a supportive academic intervention in Mathematics, English and Afrikaans.

Training for Effective Parenting was provided over a period of 10 weeks for parents/carers.

ACCESS TO A SERVICE CENTRE FOR THE ELDERLY

There are up to 84 members attending the club every week. They receive a meal, enjoys talks and workshops on relevant topics like wellbeing and safety. Exercise and the playing of memory games is encouraged. They take part in fun activities like knitting, singing and Bingo and always look forward with great excitement to an annual Christmas lunch and outing.

ACCESS TO SKILLS TRAINING FOR INCOME

Masithandane is the implementing agent for the Sedgefield Community Mosaic Project. With the help of brilliant artists like Linda Southey, Petricia Pieterse and Hyla Hartlief and talented Mosaic'ists Petrus Kiewiets, Sophia Nguma and Ricardo Baatjies, among others, our town is being transformed into the Mosaic Town of Africa. Thank you Revive Sedgefield for the repair and

With a wealth of marine life inhabiting the warm waters of the Indian Ocean, it's not uncommon to come across a seemingly stranded marine animal along the shoreline.

While your first instinct may be to rush to its rescue, there are a few things to keep in mind to ensure your and the animal's safety. (source www. animalocean.co.za)

Here are a few tips:

Observe the animal from a distance. Spend time watching it to establish whether it seems to be in distress, pain or discomfort and stop other people and pets from investigating it.

Don't touch it, pick it up or pour water on it. Even if it does seem in need of help, remain at a safe distance. Remember that these creatures are wild and may cause you harm out of an instinctive need to protect themselves. Apart from this, your presence may cause further stress.

Don't try to return it to the ocean. Some marine animals, such as seals, often make their way to shore to rest and will importance, as it will save the

not appreciate you ushering them back into the waves. Just because a seal is not moving, or sitting alone, does not mean it is sick or in need of help.

Report! If it does seem like the animal is in distress or pain, it should be reported to the relevant authorities. Time is of the essence, especially in the case of whales and dolphins that have beached. When reporting the stranded animal, it's very important that you identify what kind of creature it is. While you may not know the exact species, it will be important to explain whether it's a whale, dolphin, seal, seagull, penguin etc., so that rescuers bring the correct equipment.

Give detail. Once you've identified it, being able to describe what sort of distress it is in would also be helpful. Try to note any injuries, strange sounds and unusual movements, as well as any distinguishing physical features.

Where is it? Giving specific details about the animal's location is of utmost

rescue team a lot of time not having to figure it out themselves.

Don't move. Try and stay at the spot until the rescue team arrives. They might need you to describe the scene prior to their arrival.

Even if you are too late ... If you come across a deceased marine mammal on the beach, you should still report it. According to Marine Biologist Dr Minke Tolsma, there is a wealth of research value in the dissection of newly deceased carcasses.

While these pointers are all good and well, the most important thing you need to know is who the relevant people would be to contact.

The 2 Hour/4 Hour Rule states that foods within the Temperature Danger Zone (5 degrees – 60 degrees), including meat, poultry, eggs, dairy, seafood, cooked rice or pasta, must be used or eaten within 2 hours and thrown out after 4 hours.

Store foods in clean, dry, airtight containers and refrigerate as necessary to help keep food for longer and reduce the risk of contamination.

How to stay cool in the hot summer

Summer in Sedgefield is truly a wonderful time, and folks from all over flock here to lap up the sun and the heat. Before settling down by the pool, in the garden or at the beach there are some things you need to know about staying cool.

As we are all aware, too much exposure to the sun is harmful in many ways. One of these ways is is often caused by dehydration and some of the silly mistakes we often make when we are having

It is always important to keep our body temperature down and we have our very own built-in cooling system to assist us with this. Our ability to perspire is nature's way of cooling us down, but modern living has taught us that perspiration is unpleasant and must be prevented or blocked. Be careful of this and try to avoid excessive sun blocks and anti-perspirants if you are outside on a hot day.

Here is a list of other actions you can take to 'stay cool':

Always try to cool off by



getting into the shade or indoors as often as possible.

- Plan your outdoor activities for very early in the morning or in the early evening.
- Drink lots of water. Freeze plastic bottles of water and then you can have an ice cold drink when the water defrosts.
- Put a spray bottle of water in the fridge. You can have a cool face spray.
- Wear a wide brimmed hat. Tip the hat over and pop a couple of ice cubes or cold water into it. Put it back on and it will keep your head cool.
- Wear loose cotton clothing

in light colours. Cotton is cooler than synthetic cloth.

- A good idea to keep cool is to soak a pair of UV sleeves in cold water and put them on wet. This will keep you cool.
- Drape a damp cloth around your neck.
- To cool off you can put your arms and feet under cold water in a bucket – but be sure to share with the family - water is scarce at the moment
- Make it a family rule to have a cool shower daily instead of a hot one. This will save on electricity AND water, because they'll be in and out quickly!

Fans will cool the house down, as will opening all the doors to get a nice cool draft blowing through.

A couple of warnings that you need to be aware of: It is not advised to put ice blocks around the neck. Although this is extremely effective in cooling you down, sometimes it is too cold and can cause shock to the veins and arteries in the neck.

Also bear in mind that as nice as a cup of coffee is, or a cold beer or glass of wine, alcohol and caffeine dehydrate the body. So drink a lot of water too!

Take care and stay cool in the Sedgefield sun - and remember: everything in moderation!

Some salient and ongoing points that emerge from the saga are: Fishing line, cotton/nylon thread and string cause serious problems for birds, as it becomes entagled around their legs and feet. Care is advised when disposing of these materials and anyone finding it on the beach, in the park or in the open is requested to remove it from the open where it can cause


Different types of birds have specific diets - some are more protein based while others are comprised more of seeds.

Bread is not Good for Birds while it is filling, the low nutritional content contributes very little toward the nutrient requirements of growing birds, and bread can also ferment and cause an inflamed crop - a condition known as sour crop.

Cheese is not always good for birds - higher lactose content cheeses are difficult for birds to digest, and the various additives in some cheeses are not always beneficial.

Pet food shops stock a suitable variety of bird food products, ranging from the small grain Wild Bird Seed packs up to larger seed packs to Duck Pellet packs made up of maize and grains. Meal worm packs are available for birds requiring a more animal protein diet, and various Suet mixes are comprised of different ratios of fats, seeds and proteins.
