MOB JUSTICE ENDS IN MURDER

Whilst Knysna police are still investigating the tragic murder of a man in Sedgefield yesterday (Tuesday, 24 Jan), there is speculation that his death was the result of mob justice.

At around 7 am, residents of Disa and Agapanthus streets heard much

shouting and screaming as a group of between ten and fifteen men chased another man as he ran from the dune stairs, down Aloe Street and onto Disa Street.

One resident (name withheld) was out walking with children in the area but quickly returned home on seeing the angry crowd running

towards them along the road.

When the noise had subsided, another resident (name withheld) went to the scene to investigate the reason for the commotion and discovered a body on an empty plot in Agapanthus Street. By this

The resident contacted Sedgefield's SAPS office, and members came to the scene to investigate.

In answer to our enquiries about the incident, Media Information Officer Sergeant Chris Spies said that the officers had received the alert at approximately 07:20 and were informed that a group had fatally assaulted a man by hurling stones and bricks at him.


"Upon arrival, they found the body of a man, believed to be in his early thirties, with several wounds inflicted to his head," he stated, adding that after paramedics had declared the man dead on the scene, a murder docket was opened.

Whilst circumstances surrounding this incident are under investigation, and the motive for the killing is yet to be formally established by SAPS, reliable sources have reported that minutes before his death, the man had attacked another man on the stairway that leads over the dune, stabbing him in the arm in an attempt to rob him. Thereafter, his injured victim had reportedly given chase, with at least ten others joining him along the way – hence the shouting that

Residents in the area described how, in a seemingly desperate effort to escape the angry mob, the man had run into a property on Disa Street, then started jumping from garden to garden, over walls and fences. However, he was unable to elude his pursuers for too long as they caught up with him on Agapanthus Street.

It is unknown if anyone - other than those chasing him - witnessed the fatal assault on the man, so who and how many men took part will be left to SAPS to investigate.

At time of going to press, the name of the deceased had not been released, and those responsible for his death were still at large.

Towards the end of last year, several donors stepped into the shower together at The Living Cornerstone. The water wasn't on – they were there at the invitation of Marietjie Digue, manager of the 'Blue Gill' TLC Home for those with Alzheimer's, who was proud to show off two new 'state of the art' custom-built bathrooms to representatives of the organisations that had made them possible.

CUSTOMERS IN ARREARS WILL SOON FACE THE CONSEQUENCES

Knysna Acting Municipal Manager Roland Butler has announced that the Municipality will act against customers whose accounts are in arrears. "Municipal taxes that are in arrears will be recovered against the value of electricity units purchased," he said. "Consumers who are in pre-payment electricity meter risk having their electricity disconnected or water restricted from 31 January

'These actions will be implemented in terms of the Knysna Municipality Customer Care, Credit Control, Debt Collection, Indigent and Tampering Policy," Butler explained. "Non-payment of municipal accounts has a direct effect on the Municipality's revenue, which impacts our ability to maintain or upgrade infrastructure and deliver services."

"The income generated by municipal rates and charges is critical to the continued delivery of services," said Butler. "This is even more true now, as factors beyond our control like increased load-shedding and a global economy in crisis are placing local municipalities all over the country under severe additional pressure.'

Section 8.16 of the policy allows the Municipality to raise and recover payments in respect of arrear municipal taxes and other municipal levies, tariffs and duties in respect of services such as water, refuse removal and sanitation via a percentage of the value of units purchased for electricity allocated to any arrears, as determined by Council. It also makes provision to enforce satisfactory arrangements with consumers in arrears by blocking the prepaid meter to prevent purchasing of electricity and compel the

arrears and do not yet have a consumer to enter into a service agreement with the Council and pay the necessary fees as per the policy.

> Section 9.2 states that consumers who are in arrears with their municipal account and who have not made arrangements with Council will have their supply of electricity, water and other municipal services suspended, restricted or disconnected. Council also reserves the right to deny or restrict the sale of electricity to consumers who are in arrears with their rates or other municipal charges.

> According to section 8.15, customers in arrears who are supplied by means of an electrical credit meter must convert to a pre-payment meter or risk having their electricity supply cut or their water supply restricted. The arrears total and conversion fee will be added as a surcharge, or auxiliary, to the prepaid cost, repaid with each purchase of electricity until the debt is fully recovered.

"It is a pity that we have to resort to these measures, but we have been left with no choice," Butler said. "Those who are in arrears must realise that their debt is having a negative effect on everyone who lives in, visits and does business within Greater Knysna. Your non-payment is impinging on everyone's quality of life. Thank you to those residents who regularly pay their accounts in full. We appreciate your commitment and contribution to building an inclusive, innovative, inspired Knysna.

"During this period, Sedgefield residents may visit the Customer Services Centre (Old Standard Bank Building), Main Road Knysna, for all license and registration issues. We apologize profusely for the inconvenience," they said.

When asked for the reason for the closure, the response from the Municipal Communications Department was that the authority is currently experiencing resource challenges and cannot provide a timeframe as to when these will be resolved.

The operating hours of the Knysna licensing office are from 08:00 - 15:00.

DELAY IN REFUSE COLLECTION

"Residents and businesses are advised that we anticipate delays in the refuse collection this week. Trucks are currently collecting refuse as per the normal schedule. Refuse will be collected. Residents are requested to put refuse out on the kerbside. The cut-off time for refuse collection is 18h00. If refuse is not collected on the day per the normal schedule, it will be collected the next day.

The Editor,

A new complaint about Eskom

The residents of the Sedgefield area are all too aware of the fact that some days ago, we had the usual two lots of load-shedding but then had to suffer nearly 4 hours of unscheduled loadshedding during the afternoon and evening & then, on top of it all, the scheduled load-shedding till 22:00 that night.

The reason for this extended period, we were told, was due to a fire caused by lightning along the powerline servitude near Karatara.

Nearly two years ago, an experienced resident of Sedgefield was up in the Karatara area & noted that the Eskom power line servitude was in serious need of clearing.

I would venture a guess that Eskom has done no clearing of its 132kV power line for several years & the resulting fire from lightning is not unexpected.

BEAUTIFUL BRIDGE ART FOR BRENTON RE/MAX

The latest #knysnaartproject kicked off last week - this time at the White Bridge just off the N2 towards Sedgefield. A collaboration between the Knysna Art Society and the Western Heads/Goukamma Conservancy, the project has been co-sponsored by the Brenton on Sea, Lake Brenton, Belvidere, Belvidere Heights and Old Belvidere Residents Associations.

The White Bridge is the gateway to the Western Head and plans to tidy up and formalise the public spaces around the underpass have been in the pipeline for more than five years. The area is





a popular meeting spot for walkers and cyclists set to explore the Western Head and is a well-used drop-off and pick-up point for residents and transport operators. It has, however, been neglected and has become overgrown with alien plants. It has also become a dumping ground for contractors' rubble and general litter.

The transformation of the bridge underpass into a formal entrance of sorts to the Western Heads-Goukamma Conservancy is the first stage of the project and has a very specific objective - to make people aware of the fact that they are entering a protected conservation area with endangered fauna and flora, and to inspire them to adjust their behaviour accordingly (reduce speed, not litter, be aware of fire hazards, not pick the plants etc.)

Not many know that the area from the western bank of the Knysna estuary to

the eastern bank of the Goukamma River and from the beach inland to the N2 highway has been registered as a conservancy since 2004. Landowners, private individuals and public entities (SANParks, Cape Nature) have been working together to conserve the unique natural features, ecosystems and biodiversity of the Western Heads-Goukamma area for future generations. The Conservancy contains the most important remaining areas of near-pristine Knysna Sand Fynbos, a critically endangered vegetation type with a very high conservation value, both regionally and nationally. Sadly, 70% has already been lost, and 5% of the fynbos that remains is protected. Most of the Western Heads/Goukamma area is therefore classified as a Critical Biodiversity Area.

Local artist Lance Khoury agreed to take up the challenge of creating a series of murals on either side of the bridge that would visually communicate to all who pass under it that they are entering an area of unique biodiversity. Lance proposed outsize life-like paintings of four inhabitants of the Conservancy - a blue heron from the estuary, a whale from the ocean, a caracal from the land, and a sugarbird perched on a protea to represent the fynbos.

Lance has a passion for creating artworks that inspire and uplift. He works on private commissions that include murals, portraits and illustrations for clients across the Garden Route. He is also known around Knysna for his specialist paint techniques for interiors, furniture makeovers and other creative decorating solutions.

Once Lance's murals are completed, title signage will be erected at the top of the bridge underpass. This will be followed by the clearing and replanting of the surrounding areas, the formalisation of meeting and drop-off points and the erection of new signage and information boards. Finally, work will begin on turning the entire Western Head into an outdoor classroom that serves to educate all who visit here about the species of fauna and flora so special to the area.

There are various reasons why people are reluctant to attend their first meeting. Firstly, they're so deeply engaged in trying to cope with a stressful situation that it's hard to break away from engrained patterns of behaviour.

Many Al-Anon members have struggled for years with the difficult challenges of coping with the effects of alcoholism. Unfortunately, it's often easier to envision continued difficulties than a positive solution. That's why it's easy to think of many reasons not to attend an Al-Anon meeting.

You're not alone if you feel anxious about attending an Al-Anon meeting. Many people have felt that way. But overcoming that reluctance is an opportunity for personal growth, the first of many that the Al-Anon program offers. It's the first step on the road to recovery.

One of the Al-Anon program's basic principles is anonymity. Meetings are confidential, and we do not disclose who we see or what we hear at meetings to

anyone.

It is your choice to speak or not during meetings. Newcomers are welcomed to meetings, usually provided with literature and a local meeting list, and invited to listen and learn. Some meetings offer beginners' meetings, specifically for newcomers. Members are available to answer questions before or after the meetings.

Who are the members of Al-Anon and Alateen?

Al-Anon and Alateen members are people just like you and me-people who have been affected by someone else's drinking. They are parents, children, spouses, partners, brothers, sisters, other family members, friends, employers, employees, and coworkers of alcoholics. No matter what our specific experience has been, we share a common bond: we feel our lives have been affected by someone else's drinking.

What is alcoholism?

Alcoholism is widely recognised as a disease of compulsive drinking, which can be arrested

but not cured. It is a progressive illness, which will get only worse as long as the person continues to drink. Total abstinence from drinking is the only way to arrest the disease. Alcoholism affects the entire family; everyone who has contact with the alcoholic is affected. Unfortunately, the only people who can stop alcoholics from drinking are the alcoholics themselves.

Who are alcoholics?

They could be anyone from all backgrounds and walks of life. Over 95 per cent of alcoholics have families, friends, and jobs. They may function fairly well, but some part of their life is suffering. Their drinking causes a continuing and growing problem in their lives and the lives they

How do alcoholics affect families and friends?

Alcoholism is a family disease. The disease affects all those who have a relationship with a problem drinker. Those of us closest to the alcoholic suffer the most, and those who care the most can easily get caught up in the behaviour of another person. We react to the alcoholic's

behaviour. We focus on them, what they do, where they are and how much they drink. We try to control their drinking for them. We take on the blame, guilt, and shame that belong to the drinker. We can become as addicted to the alcoholic as the alcoholic is to alcohol. We, too, can become Meetings are held on a walk-in

basis. Al-Anon has no membership list and does not take an attendance register. You're welcome to attend as frequently or infrequently as you choose. There is never any obligation. You can choose to share your full name or not.




