# AND A 'FLEUR DE CAP' LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD GOES TO...

Congratulations to Sedgefield's very own Peter Cazalet, who has had the huge honour of winning a Fleur du Cap Lifetime Achievement Award. Peter (89), who has been quietly going about his business in the village since his semi-retirement here in 2009, is a legend in theatre circles in South Africa and abroad. So it is more than fitting that his contribution to the arts be recognised and indeed applauded with such high praise.

The winners of the 58th Fleur du Cap Theatre Awards were announced at an open-air, red-carpet celebration at the Oude Libertas Amphitheatre in Stellenbosch on the evening of Sunday, 26 March. Peter Cazalet was acknowledged for his vast contribution to the national and international arts and entertainment industry, initially as a ballet dancer, then as an award-winning set and costume designer and the Cape Performing Arts Board's Head of Design. His enduring and captivating stage designs set a high standard and are still admired and used in current productions, most recently in "Cinderella".

Michael Mitchell, a colleague and close friend Peter has mentored for a number of years, summed up the reasons why this seemingly quiet and unassuming man is so deserving of such a prestigious award.

*"Peter Cazalet's curriculum vitae reads like a history of the developments of the last 60+ years of theatre. But, his contribution is more than a catalogue of production designs.*

*Peter's career has never been circumscribed by category or country. He is, by nature, a restless and inquisitive spirit who has worked in many traditions, including opera, drama, musicals and dance, from Cape Town to Berlin to Hong Kong and America and almost everywhere in between.*

*His background in architecture and dance (ballet in particular) has left its mark as he has an incredible understanding of the stage and the human form inhabiting that*

space, together with an exceptional eye and aesthetic.

*He believes a good designer doesn't try to produce an "art object" complete, finished and subject only to aesthetic laws. However beautiful in itself the work might be, it's unlikely that it will require performers to inhabit it. The best designs are incomplete without actors, dancers and singers.*

*As a designer, he believes he was not merely to draw up the director's idea, but to contribute to the whole concept of the production, providing an entire visual world that throws new light on a play, ballet or opera.*

*His passion is to find that seminal visual idea and bring it to life on stage. He was able to do this by closely collaborating with directors and interacting with costumers, scenic artists, workshops and stage managers and crew."*

The Fleur du Cap Theatre Awards are South Africa's most prominent and longest-running awards of their kind. Nationally acclaimed performer David Kramer was the only other recipient of a Lifetime Achievement Award on the night, in recognition of his contribution to the arts and entertainment industry as an artist, singer, songwriter, guitarist, creator and producer.

This year's event was one of many which celebrated World Theatre Day on 27 March.

## BAD BUDGET FOR SEDGE WARDS

Ward 1 Councillor Leval Davis has spoken out about the draft Council Budget for 2023/2024, saying that, in his opinion, it was tabled without inputs from councillors other than the governing coalition (ANC, PBI & PA). He believes the result has been an obvious side-lining of Sedgefield's needs, Ward 1 in particular, in favour of other wards of Knysna.

"The draft was, in essence, done behind closed doors," he told The EDGE. "We didn't get a chance to give inputs into the proposed tariffs and policies and engage with the recovery plan." The

### WARD 1 & 2 COUNCILLORS SPEAK OUT

councillor pointed out that legislation requires all members of the Knysna Council to fulfil their oversight role, including the overall responsibility of approving policy, budgets and budget-related plans for the provision of basic services.

"Sedgefield, which contributes significantly to Knysna's revenue base, is simply ignored in this budget," he continues. "In a nutshell, Ward 1 Sedgefield gets very little relevant to our Integrated Development Plan

(IDP) priorities."

Davis said that whilst there were a few positives in the budget document – namely R300 000 towards Cola Beach paving repairs, R800 000 for Western feeder 11kv line upgrade, and some funding for retaining walls, wheelchair ramps and temporary toilets – these were greatly overshadowed by the negatives, with a big question next to housing which has long been a hot topic in Sedgefield.

# BAD BUDGET FOR SEDGE WARDS

“Specific housing figures for Ward 1 that were already approved in the past MTREF (Medium Term Revenue and Expenditure Framework) Budget (i.e., by Provincial and National Governments for 2023/2024 and 2024/2025) were not reflected in this draft budget document. This has been a top priority for 10 years. In the

last approved budget, there were two approved MTREF grant figures for 2023/24 (+R12 million) and 2024/25 (+R32 million). However, these figures are not reflected in the new tables. I want to know why they are not reflected, while in Ward 3, a figure of R 2.4 million is again reflected for the Vision project,” he said.

Other queries he has regarding Ward 1’s budget allocation are as follows:

- An amount of R150 000 for the Electrification of Informal Areas allocated where a minimum of R1 million is needed.

- There is no INEP (Integrated National Electrification Programme)

funding for Sedgefield, but the following Wards get INEP funding

plus R150 000 each. R8.9 million for Ward 4, R4.4 million for Ward 6, R10.9 million for Ward 7, R 9.8 million for Ward 8 and +R 954 000 for Ward 11. Sedgefield gets nothing, even though it’s a top priority.

- No money has been specifically allocated to upgrade Milkwood and Kallosie gravel streets. There is money allocated for general road upgrades in Greater Knysna, but I would like these roads mentioned specifically so they don’t ‘slip through the cracks’.

- There is no money for reticulation upgrades in Smutsville or The Island.

- There is no money for retaining walls on the Dune which is critical for the safety of residents.

- Only R 200 000 has been allocated to the Sedgefield Mouth parking area subsidence, where at least R2.2 million is needed (This has been on the cards for more than three years).

- There is no grant money for conservancy area upkeep.

- In terms of rates revenue, ratepayers will have to accept a 33% increase from R258,519,581 (2022-23) to R343,446,646 (2023-24). This is very concerning and will place a heavy burden on residents already facing financial challenges with rising food, fuel, and electricity.

- Business properties declined from 1355 to 1205; municipal properties declined from 2084 to 1399, and residential properties

increased from 16599 to 16857 (2%). A 2% increase over five years is a concern because it indicates the town is barely growing. If a 33% increase in rates is accepted, we will see disinvestment and potentially more people leaving Greater Knysna.

"I cannot, with good conscience, support this draft budget in its current form. The comment period is now open, so please make your voice heard. The Mayor should also be doing IDP/Budget roadshows, so please attend the relevant public meetings to get your comments heard," Levael warns.

His DA colleague Cleone Vanston, Councillor for Ward 2, was also extremely unhappy with the draft budget, pointing out that she and other members of the opposition coalition had been given minimal time to study the paperwork before debating it in council.

Asked for comment, she said, "It is very sad to see yet again the draft budget created with the expectation that the rich must subsidize the poor and the middle-income residents will be most affected too."

"The ANC Mayor's budget suggests that the council approves the following increases for the five main revenue sources with effect from 1 July 2023.

- Service Charges:-  
 Electricity 18.65% (this is due to Eskom's 18% increase)  
 Water 9%,  
 Sanitation 5.3%,  
 Refuse 6%,  
 Other 5.3 %.

Whilst I am happy to see Ward 2 budget items on the Capital Budget, it is disheartening to know that so little is focused on the ward.

To name a few:-

Electricity Distribution:- Replacement of Groenvlei 11kv line, R 500 000;

Water reticulation:- Re-alignment of Karawater pipeline R800 000, and Bulk Water supply for Karatara R400 000.

These are the only specific capital budgets for Ward 2.

All other items state the whole of the Municipality, and I have highlighted the need to upgrade gravel roads in my ward and the long overdue fencing of the Karatara cemetery (there is a

budget of R800 000 for all wards for fencing, so I have requested a portion of this.

I have also requested that generators be issued to the Sedgefield Municipal building so that service delivery can continue during load shedding and that our roads in Ward 2 be upgraded.

The draft budget and draft IDP will be open for public comment, and public participation is to take place before it is approved.

I will keep residents informed of public participation dates and urge all ratepayers to submit public comments on the draft budget."

## THE BLUE-SPOTTED GIRDLED LIZARD

### *Ninurta coerulepunctatus*

The Blue-spotted girdled lizard is a fairly common reptile that occurs throughout the Garden Route and is found everywhere, from forest fringes to coastal cliffs.

It is the only member of the monotypic genus *Ninurta*, once considered part of *Cordylus*. Despite the frequency with which they are found, they are endemic to the Garden Route district, occurring nowhere else in the world. They are found on or near rocks, often hiding inside cracks when geology allows.

The body is black or very dark grey and striped on top with yellowish streaks. The back, sides and head are often sprinkled with bright blue spots, hence the name. When breeding, males develop an orange throat (see pic).

This species is primarily insectivorous but will also include small lizards in its diet. When searching for this eye-catching endemic, look in rocky areas- the rockier the better.

## FOOD SECURITY GRANT GOES BEYOND NUTRITION

A R1 000 000 grant from the Western Cape Government through the Garden Route District Municipality will be used to support the Greater Knysna Food Security Forum. Knysna Municipal Manager Ombali Sebola said that the Joint District and Metro Approach Grant allows for the implementation of a coordinated and effective Food Security Project.

“This project will not only address the existing and immediate food crisis,” he said. “It will facilitate short-term job creation and empower participants in the long-term with valuable skills development and training in small-scale food production and permaculture.”

The Food Security Project will continue the work of the Greater Knysna Food Security Forum by supporting eleven small, medium and large sites in the Greater Knysna municipal area. The grant will also support backyard grower groups that are part of the forum. A learning space pilot project is also on the cards in one of the areas where learners from the school can be involved in gardening.

“The main concern is, of course, offering fresh produce to those who need it the most,” Sebola explained. “The elderly, learners at schools and creches, and the hungry will benefit from enhanced nutrition with meals supplemented with fresh, healthy ingredients. While twenty-four short-term jobs will

be created on a three-month basis, participants will benefit from training in a range of subjects. Knowledge of soil fertility, compost, crop rotation, propagation, permaculture and basic organic growing as a business model will set them up for long-term success in growing healthy food and, potentially, business. Winter is approaching. It is a great time to plant and grow, connect with nature, the environment, local food production and its possibilities.”

Employment beneficiaries were identified via the municipal database and will be paid in line with the Expanded Public Works Programme’s (EPWP) rates. Only currently unemployed and indigent individuals were considered, and youths and women made up the bulk of appointees. Following EPWP protocol, appointments were made from within the wards where work is undertaken.

Local NPO Green Hearted will serve as the implementing agent for the Knysna Food Security Project. The project will also be coordinated and implemented from within the municipality’s community services directorate. An internal project steering committee will provide the necessary advisory support in the implementation of the project.

Since it was formed in 2020, the Greater Knysna Food Security Forum has supported many backyard growers, created a

new community garden and a new school garden, and established a pilot project with a seedling nursery that supplies backyard growers, schools and community gardens. The forum comprises various stakeholders, including Knysna Municipality, Green Hearted, local NPOs, the Community Work Programme, Community Development Workers, the Knysna Initiative for Learning and Teaching, Sparkling Minds and the Breede-Gouritz Catchment Management Agency.

“Knysna has an excellent climate and soil for growing food. Through sustainable projects like this and amazing partnerships, we can ensure that no one starves, revalue food and create job opportunities. Knysna Municipality is committed to alleviating the food crisis many of our residents are facing. This is evident in our collaborative efforts with the other members of the Greater Knysna Food Security Forum,” Sebola concluded. “Council has also resolved to provide an internal budget for the next financial year – and those to come – to augment any available funding for the Food Security Project. The right to food is a human right recognised under national and international law and is linked to one’s right to dignity and life. This project brings us another step closer to ensuring that no Knysna residents go hungry and that all are assured a dignified life.”

**Dear Editor**  
 Water Crisis & Sedgefield????  
 We are part of Greater Knysna whether we like it or not. When Knysna Municipality stated some months ago that all residents had to conserve water due to the drought and we could

only use municipal water for domestic purposes, the residents of Sedgefield had to comply as well.

Whilst I have no problem with the concept of conserving water, it is rather ironic that Sedgefield has not had a water crisis at all and has not for some while, despite the lack of rainfall in our area.

If one looks at the rainfall in the Karatara catchment, as shown by the Auto Rain Gauge at Farleigh, in the last year, the average rainfall at Farleigh has been 94.1 mm per month, while at the Water Treatment Works (WTW), the average rainfall has only been 35.8 mm per month.

If one has a look at the amount of water that has been extracted from the Karatara River in the last 14 months to serve Sedgefield, only 64,4% of our potable water has been from the Karatara River.

The least was in October 2022, when the yield of potable water from the Karatara River reduced

Should the recipient choose to discard the meal ticket, at least your R5 will still have gone to the Masithandane feeding scheme, which assists many hungry people on a daily basis.

This system has been put in place in an effort to stop those on the street, particularly children, from using 'food money' given in good faith to support negative habits.

# RESIDENTS SIGN NOISE PETITION

Residents of Groenvallei, Meedingsride, and Smutsville in Sedgefield, fed up with Knysna Municipality's inability to enforce the by-laws on loud noises that disturb the peace, have served a petition, signed by 154 residents, on the municipal authorities.

The noise is in the form of loud music and related base sounds heard most weekends from early morning to late at night. The loud music emanates from several illegal shebeens in the informal settlement above the dunes adjacent to these areas. At times the noise is audible throughout the night.

The problem is an ongoing one that has plagued residents for several years. Despite persistent complaints by members of the public to the Law Enforcement Department of Knysna

Municipality, the South African Police Services (SAPS), and other officials, the problem still needs to be solved.

According to the Knysna Municipal By-law on Public Nuisances, people who ignore warnings to avoid creating a nuisance by playing loud music should receive a fine of R1,000. If they persist after that, equipment should be confiscated under threat of further legal action leading to imprisonment.

Resident Bartley Joseph told The Edge that the authorities responsible seemed unable or



unwilling to address the problem. "When residents report these incidents, they should be addressed immediately. Instead, however, we are fed lame excuses about officials not having access to vehicles to travel to the source of the problem or staff being unavailable due to other priorities," he said.

The petitioners initially intended that the petition appealing for action would be handed to Ward 1 DA Councillor Levael Davis. However, when they failed to secure a meeting with him, it was redirected to Councillor Cleone Vanston, who accepted it on 30 March 2023 with an undertaking to ensure that it reached the relevant officials at Knysna Municipality. She explained that, for years, the council has been trying to coordinate the necessary action to deal with the matter effectively. But, unfortunately, it is a complex matter that requires the full cooperation of a range of departments. Nevertheless, she confirmed that there are ongoing efforts to resolve the issue.

For several years, an Easter Sunday 'Sunrise Service' has traditionally been held next to the water tower on top of Sedge Hill, just off Cycad Circle, and this year is no different. Celebrating the Rising of The Son with the rising of the sun, one might say.

The gathering will commence at 6:30, with the sunrise due at 6:48. Please feel free to join this special time of fellowship. Directions will be signposted from Volstruis Street (the continuation of Makou). The gathering typically lasts no more than 45 minutes.

### COLD SORES OR FEVER BLISTERS

**Crusty, blistering and peeling: where do cold sores come from, and what can you do about them?**

Three-quarters of Australians are living with herpes simplex virus type 1 (HSV-1), an infection which causes cold sores. These tiny fluid-filled lesions and blisters sit along the mouth and nose area.

This is not the same virus that causes genital herpes, HSV-2, in about 13% of people worldwide. In most cases, the body is quite good at suppressing HSV-1 with help from the immune system, which means that not everyone with the virus knows they have it.

However, the virus can sometimes overwhelm the system and present as a cold sore, a highly contagious sore on the mouth.

**Always at the worst time.**

Around 92% of us have viruses inside our systems from past infections. However, for most people, these are latent and do not cause any concerns until reactivated.

While we can keep these viruses

from reactivating and causing any issues, most of the time, exhaustion, physical exertion, and psychological stress can suppress elements of the immune system. Unfortunately, this leaves our body weakened and opens the door to viruses.

Common reactivation of latent viruses includes those that cause glandular fever and chicken pox/shingles.

**When HSV-1 reactivates, it may present as cold sores.**

This usually starts as a tingling, itching, or burning sensation around the mouth, lips, or nose. Fluid-filled blisters will subsequently form, which dry out and leave a crust after about a week. The scab then flakes off and will typically heal within one to two weeks without leaving a scar.

Along with cold sores, other common symptoms of an active HSV-1 infection can include fever, nausea, headaches, sore throat, or swollen glands.

**Cold sores can get anyone.**

Viruses can spread quickly and easily. If we do have an infection, preventing its spread is important.

Babies and children are particularly vulnerable. For example, around 38% of mothers kiss their babies on the lips, and 14% share a spoon with them. These practices can spread HSV-1, particularly in the first four weeks after birth, when a baby has the weakest immune defences. So, as a general rule, always avoid kissing a baby on the lips to prevent spreading infections.

Sun exposure and cool weather encourage the appearance of cold sores, as they can dry out the lips and damage the skin, creating a favourable environment for the virus.

Some treatments are available. If you are having trouble with cold sores, you can ask a doctor or pharmacist to outline some options for antiviral medicines. These impact the virus' ability to reactivate, replicate, and divide.

**So I have a cold sore, what should I do?**

Unfortunately, there is no cure for the underlying virus. But if you do have a cold sore, here are some things you can do to help:

- Keep your hands clean, and don't touch the sores.

The wine's appearance is clear, with a light grassy colour. No legs, as can be expected of a young white wine. The nose is without any flaws and clean. An initial sniff indicates a slight alcohol smell. Guava, Nectarine, and hints of white Asparagus on the nose. The taste leads to Green Pears, Nectarines and greenish Gooseberries. High acidity, which hits the sides of the tongue. Short to medium mouth feel with a crisp finish. The wine was awarded Double Gold by Michelangelo. Best for drinking in about two years. Good with fish or pork. The wine ghost sees this as an easy-drinking, young wine in the R60-R80 range.
