

In the aftermath of the fire...

A great deal has been going on since the devastating fire destroyed so many homes in Smutsville three weeks ago, the most important being the construction of replacement dwellings for the victims.

According to Ward 1 Councillor Levael Davis, at time of going to press (Tuesday, 19 September), 22 houses out of the 31 lost had been replaced by Knysna Municipality's

Housing Department. The new structures, made of zinc-iron sheets on wooden frames, are far less flammable than the previous informal homes. Work continues on site, and the rest of the replacement homes will be handed over in due course.

"Electrical connections will happen in time once the council has approved a special dispensation to waive the costs," the Councillor informed us.

"The families that had moved into the Community Hall straight after the fire have made alternative arrangements with friends and family, and the hall is now empty," he added, "But we are still pushing the Housing Department to finish the replacement homes as quickly as possible."

He said they were also waiting for the National Housing Settlements Disaster Management Department to

fulfil its promise to supply extra building materials for the fire victims.

Davis once again offered a huge vote of thanks to all those who have come to the aid of those who lost so much in the fire, saying that the affected community had repeatedly voiced their appreciation.

"The assistance will continue," he said, "Once every victim is safely in their new home, there are individuals and organisations standing by to help with household goods and appliances." He added that anyone wanting to help should call him on 060 998 7136.

Davis wished to emphasise that no blame had been apportioned

for the fire, a fact confirmed by the Knysna Fire Department. "It's sad to hear that some individuals have been victimised by community members about this issue," he said, "Let's rather move forward together than challenge one another."

He pointed out that from the start of this disaster, community leaders had pulled together and stepped up to the plate. "They sacrificed so much of their time to assist, some even booking off from work," he said, "Some faced criticism but still remained strong. I look forward to standing shoulder to shoulder with them all to build a stronger Sedgefield together.'

THE DANCING OF POLITICS

When news broke in Knysna last week of the Patriotic Alliance (PA) stepping away from the ANC Coalition and not voting on any council issues, many believed that the Democratic Alliance (DA) would use this to their advantage and retake control of the Knysna Council.

It stood to reason that with ten councillors in the DA coalition (8 DA and 2 KIM) and the two PA councillors abstaining from the vote, the ANC coalition would only have nine votes, including those of partners PBI and EFF (each with one councillor).

According to party leader Gayton Mckenzie, the PA's reason for

leaving was that his party's wishes had been "disrespected" by the ANC Coalition as it had made municipal staff appointments against the PA's express wishes. Mckenzie also vowed that the PA would not vote at future council meetings.

But the DA chose not to take the step of tabling a 'vote of no confidence' in the Council's current ANC coalition leadership, reasoning that the PA had gone back on their word before (they left the DA coalition in August last year to vote with the ANC) and would no doubt do it again.

Before their words could even go to print, the PA proved the DA correct.

At a Special Council Meeting on 15 September, the opposition tabled motions to rescind the same appointments that had allegedly disrespected the Patriotic Alliance. However, instead of abstaining from the vote, the PA Councillors voted WITH their 'former' partners of the ANC coalition, thus ensuring the controversial appointments were approved.

Says Knysna's Constituency Head for the DA, Dion George, "The PA has, yet again, contradicted itself and proven itself untrustworthy. Its signature on a coalition agreement means nothing, and the DA will never return to a coalition with them or form agreements with them."



SR&RA Update on Sedgefield Service Delivery

Sedgefield has faced some distressing events over the last month, including the protest action and the fire in Beverley Hills. The Sedgefield Ratepayers & Residents Association continues to lobby Knysna Municipality on various service delivery issues, many of which have been raised repeatedly.

Housing

The desperate need for housing in Ward 1 is a long-standing community issue. In discussion with Cllr Davis, the SR&RA proposed re-establishing a housing task team comprising nominated representatives of all the interested and affected parties from Ward 1 and 2, as well as Provincial and local municipal representatives.

Housing is the number one priority of the Ward 1 Integrated Development Plan. Despite this, there has been minimal traction and progress on the execution of this priority. Residents from both wards are either directly or indirectly affected.

The last few weeks' events in Sedgefield show that the issue needs strategic attention. The purpose of this task team would

- To represent the interests of all stakeholders in Sedgefield as far as housing is concerned.
- To create a representative and recognised stakeholder forum to engage with local and provincial IHS representatives and to be given specific, unambiguous, and honest answers on the status quo since

the previous protest action in

- To receive clarity on the formal housing budget allocation for 2024-2026
- To confirm timelines and execution plan for the Ward 1 legal housing initiative

The proposed task team would act as a conduit between **Integrated Housing Settlements** and the local community and provide ongoing progress on this priority issue for Sedgefield.

Given that housing remains a Provincial function, we are happy to report that Cllr Davis has made such a request to Minister Simmers. We look forward to a positive response to this request so that we can all receive clarity on the proposed design, aesthetics, and scope of the proposed formal housing solution for Smutsville.

By-Laws

We continue to seek clarity on the current status of municipal by-laws and the establishment of the municipal court in Knysna. We have formally requested Knysna Municipality to identify and communicate the specific by-laws that have been amended and approved. This step will help us understand the municipality's adherence to revised regulations. It is cold comfort that, having repeatedly raised the concern of an increased probability of fire risk, this is precisely what occurred in Sedgefield in

Safety, Security & Law **Enforcement**

The SR&RA met with Col. De

Wet and sent a list of concerns to Major General Modishana and Premier Alan Winde. We fully support the Sector 6 CPF's requests for increased workforce, vehicles, and resources at Sedgefield Police Station and await the outcome of the in-depth investigation. Based on the recommendations of Col de Wet, we support establishing a Safety & Security Committee at Knysna Municipality to enable a more coordinated approach and development of a clear safety and security plan.

It is now urgent that a permanent appointment be made to replace Mr S. Langlands (retired) as Manager of Protection Services. We also request the work of a permanent law enforcement officer in Sedgefield and continue to emphasise the importance of well-trained law enforcement officers in ensuring the safety and security of our community. We are awaiting feedback from Knysna Municipality regarding the offer from Col de Wet, SAPS Knysna Station Commander, to train municipal law enforcement officials.

The noise disturbance and illegal activity on the dune continue, seemingly unabated. SR&RA has requested the Municipality indicate how many complaints were received from residents from 1 February 2021 to 30 September 2022 and 1 October 2022 to 31 August 2023 and how many fines were issued.

We have also requested an investigation and feedback into reported SAP vehicle abuse and appropriate actions to prevent further misuse.

Financial Affairs

The August budget figures are very concerning; the municipality's budget report points out:

- As of 31 August 2023, the Commitments still exceed the Cash and Cash Equivalents. The cash flow position remains a critical concern.
- Strict expenditure control must be implemented to ensure that unauthorised expenditure is avoided and that municipal funds are not abused. It has become evident that Cost Control and Cost Reduction need more attention.
- The Cash Coverage Ratio on 31 August 2023 equates to 0.17 months compared to the National Treasury norm of 1-3
- It is exceptionally concerning that the Municipality continues to deteriorate, over a five-year period, to levels below the National Treasury Norm
- It is envisaged that the Municipality may experience more cashflow challenges in the last quarter of this calendar year. It may become necessary to consider accessing an overdraft

facility, which the Council has already approved. The overdraft facility will only be applied for / accessed as and when required.

- Important to note is that there is capacity to accommodate more loans, but the cash flow of the municipality does not support
- The total outstanding debtors have decreased by R26.2 million from R508.2 million on 31 July 2023 to R482.0 million on 31 August 2023.
- · As a result of no bids from Financial Service Providers to fund the Budgeted Borrowings amount of R25 million, an item will be submitted to the Council for an appropriate resolution on the way forward.

Roads

We have sent an updated master list of all reported potholes and areas that need complete resealing. Whilst there has been some progress in this regard, the general state of our road infrastructure leaves much to be desired.

Boat Launch

It is encouraging to see the progress on replacing the poles at the Ski Boat Launch started last week. Our thanks to Knysna Municipality for their work so far.

Service Delivery

The ongoing political instability in the council and the ensuing debacle over the selection and appointment of permanent directors leaves Greater Knysna residents frustrated at the lack of progress. SR&RA continues to engage with our two ward councillors and municipal officials, adding our voices to many concerned and affected by Sedgefield's service delivery

His music was a gift, and he shared it generously with everyone who passed by. He had a way of making you feel like you were a part of something bigger, something beautiful, just by being there.







SAFETY & ACCESS TO THE BEACHES TAKE PRIORITY AS CLEANUP AND DAMAGE ASSESSMENTS CONTINUE

Issued by George Municipality, 19 September 2023

George Municipality is working hard to ensure the safety of its residents following the high spring tides that hit the coastal areas of George over the past weekend. Cleanup efforts are in full swing, and damage assessments have been focused on water pipes for potable water supply and electrical components. Below, we give an overview of the damages at the various beaches in George.

Wilderness had some infrastructure damage to the Leentjies Braai area/recreational sites, some sand deposits on the N2 bridge, and minor damage to private properties. Also, damage to signage and wood structures. All the above beaches are still closed to the public for recreational use to allow for clean-up and damage assessments. The municipality is doing everything possible to ensure that residents and visitors have access to the area as soon as possible.

Victoria Bay beach suffered moderate damages to Municipal infrastructure and private properties. Ablution buildings were flooded and retaining walls and sidewalks were damaged. Residential buildings sustained damage to gates and garage doors and some water flooding. Steps to the beach have been destroyed. Members of the public are advised to be

Gwaing River's lifeguard tower was damaged and concrete pillars were unearthed.

Herold's Bay suffered extensive damage to municipal infrastructures and private properties. The value of the damages is still being determined as clean-up operations continue. The sewerage pump station was affected. Stand-by generators flooded and bridges, roadways, sidewalks and retaining walls were damaged. Sand deposits in the roadway are making access difficult and are being dealt with. Alternative Sewerage arrangements have already been made to ensure and prevent a breach.

WHITE WHALES OF WILDERNESS

Every year, between May and mid December, Humpback and Southern Right whales migrate northwards from the freezing Antarctic waters to nursery grounds in the warmer coastal waters of the African continent to calve.

While the Humpback Whales continue northwards to the tropics, the Southern Right Whales remain along the southern coastline of the Western Cape, with aggregations between Cape Agulhas and Plettenberg

Layers of Blubber

One of the primary drivers of these migrations is their search for warmer water to give birth. Adult Humpback and Southern Right whales have a blubber layer 28cm to 32cm and between 35cm and 42cm respectively to insulate them against the freezing Antarctic waters which are their summer feeding region.

Whale calves, when they are born, have substantially thinner blubber layers and would freeze if they were born in the cold Antarctic waters.

The reason that the Southern Right Whales only migrate as far as the Southern Cape waters is that, because of the adults thicker blubber layer, they would 'over heat' in warmer sub tropical and tropical waters.

Colour Variation

In Southern Right Whales there are three colour morphs, namely black, grey and partial grey morphs.

Black morphs are born black and can have a white blaze of variable size, which remains white throughout the lifespan of the

Partial morphs are born either grey or with black, brown and grey natches which darken as the whale ages.

Grey morphs, which are about 4% of the population, are born white and can have black or brown blazes which also darken with age.

Genetic Variation

Southern Right Whales are polymorphic for an X-linked pigmentation pattern known as grey morphism. Most SRWs have completely black skin with white patches on their bellies and occasionally on their backs; these patches remain white as the whale ages. Grey morphs appear mostly white at birth, with a splattering of rounded black marks; but as the whales age, the white skin gradually changes to a brownish grey colour.



Studies have shown that both male and female Southern Right Whales have a high level of nursery fidelity which results in the recurrence of grey and partial grey morphs being born at particular nursery locations. The 2022 and 2023 sightings of two grey morph calves in Wilderness would suggest that the chance of future white calves being born in the same area would be high and we can expect more sightings in the future.

Identification Markings

Each Southern Right Whale has distinctive white patches on their head and jaws and sometimes on their tails. Unlike skin pigmentation, these white patches are called callosities.

Callosities are rough patches of textured skin that form distinctive patterns on each whale. The callosities are present at birth and are a individual pattern for each whale which allows for an accurate visual identification for whale watchers and cetacean researches.

Pale Humpback's

Humpback Whales are born light grey or white and darken to a dark brown or black dorsal surface within weeks, making it easy to identify the approximate area that a calf was born when a grey calf is seen.

Wilderness White Calves

While the main Southern Right Whale nursery areas are Walker Bay, De Hoop Marine Protected Area and Witsand Bay, there are some birthing areas at Plettenberg Bay and at Wilderness.

In 2022, a light grey Southern Right Whale was born in Wilderness Bay and a second white one was born in August

An unusual sighting in August 2023 was a light grey Humpback Whale calf, the light colour suggesting that it had been born in the area. What makes this unusual is that Humpback Whales normally give birth in the warmer waters of the Eastern Cape all the way up to the Mozambican Channel.

The significance of the birth of a calf in Wilderness Bay is that newborn Humpback Whale calves have a thin layer of blubber with poor insulation and can't survive in the cooler Western Cape waters. With reports of at least three additional grey Humpback Whale calves sighted in the Western Cape, this could be an indication of climate change and sea temperature increases that are sufficient to support calving of this species at more southern latitudes.

Variation in Annual Whale **Sightings**

Records from an annual census of the Southern Right Whale population along the South African coastline indicate that the average calving interval of has increased from between 3 to five years to as much as 7 years. SRW's are referred to as capital breeders meaning that the females need to bulk up their fat reserves to be able to migrate to the winter nursery areas where they don't feed for the approximate 6 months that they are there. This means that they have to bulk feed in their Antarctic feeding grounds.

The increase in the calving interval to seven years would suggest that there is a decrease of their regular food supply, krill and zooplankton, and that the SRW population spends more time bulking up to their target migration weight. The decrease of their food supply is link to a combination of the expansion of a krill fishery in Antarctica and to increased sea temperatures driven by climate change.

A total of 1,136 SRW's were counted in 2023 which was more than double of the annual count between 2019 and 2022, but still lower than the count of 1,454 recorded in 2018.

Suicide is the final symptom of a brain that is no longer able to cope, just like any other type of organ failure, it is the result of an illness that has become terminal.

Some people die by suicide without necessarily showing their intentions. If you have an uneasy feeling that someone may be thinking about suicide, it is very likely that by this time, the person is already well advanced with their plans to die.

For a person to consider suicide, the distress and suffering they are experiencing seems inescapable and endless, exceeding their perceived capacity to cope. Suicide may seem like the only way to escape the pain when a person feels their heart is broken, their soul is shattered, and their body can no longer fight. A person's mind may beg for release, even at the expense of life itself

The risk factors for suicide are a combination of biological, psychological and social factors, often all coming together at once in a potentially lethal mix that leaves a person buckling under the unbearable weight of their pain, worry, fear, grief, and despair.

Any one of us could find ourselves in a suicidal frame of mind if faced with a set of personal tragic and unfortunate circumstances that could threaten to break us. It is part of our shared humanity that we find ourselves in dark spaces at times, therefore no one has a place to judge a person for feeling suicidal. Instead, this is the time to offer compassion and kindness.

Suicide is a worrying, growing global phenomenon. People of all ages and from all walks of life take their own lives, and it is naïve to imagine it could not happen in your family, social circle, or workplace. According to the Global Health Estimates Report 2019, South Africa has a suicide rate of 23.5 deaths per 100 000 population compared to a global average of nine per 100 000

The local statistics for teenagers are deeply concerning, as the South African Depression and Anxiety Group (SADAG) reports that 17.6% of teens have considered attempting suicide, and as many as one in five 18-year-olds have had one or more suicide attempts.

Suicide can result from factors

like mental health concerns, grief, trauma, physical illness, bullying, abuse, serious relationship troubles, work and financial problems, loneliness, burnout, and a family history of suicide.

Men and boys are at higher risk of completing suicide, and it has been suggested that outdated notions of what it means to be a man, as in "cowboys don't cry", contribute to this as males may find it more difficult to talk about feelings of emotional distress and ask for help due to shame and stigma. Substance use and financial pressures are also believed to be significant factors driving male suicide globally.

Never dismiss, brush off, shame, minimise, invalidate, or turn away from a suicidal person when they are trying to communicate their distress and their intentions. It is a myth that talking about suicide will increase the chances of it happening. We should never avoid having a conversation that could save a life.

It can be difficult to find the words to open these conversations, and a helpful start could be, "It must be so very hard for you to be feeling like this, I would really like to understand and offer my help to you". Most importantly, let the person know they are not alone.

Always seek help from a mental or medical health care practitioner who is professionally trained to assess and treat this particular emergency. Be proactive, don't wait. The suicide warning, or even a para-suicide attempt, is always a powerful communication of desperation and seeking help. Some people have lived to regret regarding a loved one's threat of suicide as "attention seeking" or "manipulative behaviour".

Judgment simply alienates the person in their loneliest hour and cuts off sorely needed potential support. Please take notice and extend a hand to anyone who might be at risk. Treat the warning signs of suicide as a medical emergency, and do not leave the suicidal person alone. We should never underestimate the power of a kind presence when a person is in despair. Loneliness often tips a person from holding on to life to the decision to die.

SIDEBAR 1: A tool kit for suicide awareness

Seven potential warning signs that a person could be suicidal:

- 1. Long lasting feelings of sadness or hopelessness
- sadness or hopelessness
 2. Extreme mood swings
- 3. Loss of interest in previously pleasurable activities
- 4. Risky and self-harming behaviours, such as driving under the influence
- 5. Making preparations to die, such as getting personal affairs

ADDRESSING COMPLEX CHALLENGES **FACING CHILDREN WITH FOETAL ALCOHOL SPECTRUM DISORDERS**

International Foetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD) Awareness Day is commemorated annually on 9 September to create awareness among women and communities on the dangers of alcohol consumption during pregnancy. This day also aims to shed light on the challenges and difficulties for both the mom and the child diagnosed with FASD. The theme this year was 'beyond all limits'. We want to encourage individuals and the community at large to go 'beyond all limits' in supporting, caring for and loving those affected.

Alcohol consumption during pregnancy results in a number of neurological, physical and mental conditions. 'A child with foetal alcohol syndrome often presents with coordination difficulties, hyperactivity, poor judgement, poor impulse control, delayed gross motor development, sensory hypersensitivity and low frustration toleration,' said Michelle Jenkins (occupational therapist, George Hospital).

Staff Nurse, Dornay Ceasar said that these children are usually seen for assessment and then

referred to the patient's nearest clinic for further follow-up. The Inclusive Education Team may become involved to assist with school placement if indicated. Encounters with children who have been diagnosed with FASD can be extremely challenging as they tend to display extreme emotions of playfulness and happiness or extreme emotions of irritation and anger. Anne-Marie Syfers (nurse, George Hospital) said that when caring

for children diagnosed with FASD and other underlying conditions associated with FASD, it is important to be patient and interact with them on their level.

At George Hospital, both occupational and physiotherapy aims to improve fine and gross motor control through activities such as playing, building, climbing etc, and addresses the sensory sensitivity depending on

WORLD ATOPIC ECZEMA DAY 2023

Raising awareness of the physical and emotional impacts of eczema

The 14th September was World Atopic Eczema Day – an annual event that raises awareness around a common skin disease that can massively impact sufferers - both physically and psychologically.

Atopic eczema, which is an inflammatory skin condition that causes chronic itchiness, dry skin, rashes, scaly patches, blisters and skin infections, is one of the most prevalent skin disorders – globally, it affects up to 20% of all children and 10% of

What are the symptoms of atopic eczema?

- Itchy, dry and sensitive skin that becomes inflamed and discoloured
- Rough, leathery or scaly skin, appearing as scaly patches
- Oozing or crusting
- Areas of swelling

Everyone's eczema experience is different. You might have all of these symptoms of eczema or only just a few. You might have some flare-ups that last for days, weeks or months - or your symptoms could go away

What can trigger an atopic eczema flare-up?

Along with having a family history of eczema, many common household items can cause allergic reactions leading to an atopic eczema flare. Additional common triggers of eczema may include:

- Extended exposure to dry air, extreme heat or cold
- Some types of soap, shampoos, bath products, body wash, facial cleansers and baby wipes
- Laundry detergents and fabric softeners with chemical additives

How to treat eczema?

Proper, consistent skin care is essential in preventing and managing eczema. Moisturizers, antihistamines, topical steroid creams and corticosteroids are among the potential courses of eczema treatments usually recommended by healthcare providers and dermatologists.

Why eczema is more than "just a skin condition"

Whilst often dismissed as "just a skin condition" people who suffer from eczema experience physical and emotional consequences that can seriously impact their quality of life.

Children in particular, don't sleep well at night because of the itchiness and discomfort caused by eczema, and therefore may not focus optimally at school and get the most out of their days. The rash and subsequent skin




