GEORGE POULTRY TESTS POSITIVE FOR AVIAN FLU

Western Cape Minister of Agriculture, Dr Ivan Meyer has announced that the first case of H7 High Pathogenicity Avian Influenza (HPAI) has been diagnosed in the George area.

This following the recent, much publicised detection of the H7 high pathogenicity avian influenza (HPAI) in the Gauteng, Mpumalanga, Free State and Limpopo provinces.

It is believed that the virus reached George following the introduction of chickens from an infected province in the North. The George farm has been quarantined and culling on the farm has already started.

The minister also warned that the H5N1 HPAI virus that caused seven outbreaks in the Western Cape from April to June 2023, is still a threat from wild birds. "In the past three months the Western Cape hasn't experienced any further outbreaks in the commercial poultry industry. All the outbreaks reported in the period between April and June have been resolved. Whilst under quarantine, the farms had been depopulated, cleaned and disinfected twice with the State Veterinarian's inspection. The quarantine was lifted, and the outbreaks were reported as resolved

and disclosed to the Department of Agriculture, Land Reform and Rural Development (DALRRD) and the World Organisation of Animal Health (WOHA) respectively," he said.

"Western Cape poultry owners are urged to heighten biosecurity measures as far as possible and be extremely cautious as to bringing in any new chickens or allowing visitors or vehicles into poultry farms. Moving chickens from infected provinces should be avoided at all costs as this has a severe impact on the entire Western Cape province if more cases of H7 HPAI are detected," added Minister Meyer.

State veterinarian and Director of Animal Health, Dr Nolvuyo Magadla continues to appeal to poultry owners to adhere to general recommendations to prevent transmission of the disease between farms. She discourages interprovincial movement of birds and advises farmers to avoid these movements until avian influenza outbreaks are under control.

READY TO ROCK THE AR WORLD CHAMPS

The 2023 Adventure Racing World Championship hosted by Expedition Africa is set to start tomorrow (19 October), and our prediction is that local man John Collins and his Merrell Songlines teammates will be in it for a win!

109 four-person teams (that's 436 competitors) from all around the world will line up at the start at Cape St Francis Resort, including the best of the best of the world's adventure racers as well as teams taking part just to make it to the end. Whilst the front runners may finish the gruelling, 800-kilometre course in four days, others will be out for anything up to nine!

It is hoped that the Songlines foursome (Captain Kelvin Trautman, Lance Kime, Jeannie Bomford-Dreyer and John Collins) will use their 'home soil' advantage and grab themselves a podium position.

Unlike sports that take place on courts and in arenas, Adventure Racing courses include multiple disciplines of trekking, mountain biking, paddling and navigation and are staged over a vast area incorporating mountains, valleys, rivers, lakes, the sea, wilderness areas, nature reserves, and farms. In addition, the teams keep moving day-and-night in this non-stop, expedition, race format. Yet it's still a spectator sport:- Adventure races may be followed by supporters - from the comfort of their offices and homes - through live online tracking, and the reports, photos and videos posted by on-the-ground media.

Whilst Merrell Songlines (race #11) is currently the top team in Africa, their compatriots in Team Merrell (#13) are also highly ranked and both will be racing for the top places. Two other teams of locals taking part are "Pinegold" (#34) and "4 the Love of Buschy" (#17).

With one day to go, prepare to be captivated, enthralled, and inspired by astounding performances cunning navigation decisions, courageous efforts, and displays of fortitude and perseverance by teams striving just to get to the end.

For families, friends, supporters and adventure racers at home, there are many ways to follow this 800-kilometre event, but probably the most exciting is what is known as 'Dot Watching' via live GPS tracking.

Each team carries a SPOT tracking unit that transmits a signal giving their position at any

time.

For the duration of the event, 'Dot Watchers' will be suitably distracted from their everyday activities in their efforts to follow their teams dots moving in real time from checkpoint to checkpoint and through transitions. Watch rivalries unfold, observe teams searching for a checkpoint, and select multiple teams to compare their route choices.

To aid your viewing, the satellite base map has an overlay indicating the locations of checkpoints and transitions as well as a track showing the most likely route that teams will take from one point to the next.

Connected to the tracking page is a leaderboard that shows current rankings. By clicking on a team name, you can see a team photograph and the names of the team members. Each dot shows the last time updated and the team's current speed. You will be

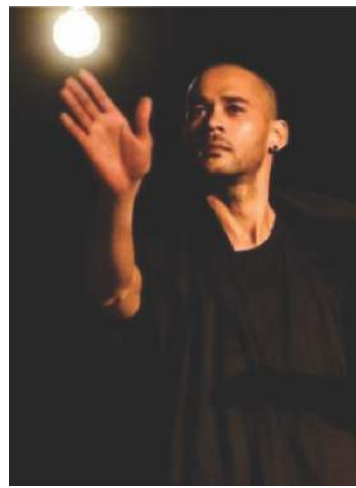

e'Pap celebrates 20 years and 11 million meals

Over the weekend of 7 and 8 October, the founders of the e'Pap project Shelley Godsell, Lally Viljoen and Peter Godsell hosted an event at which some 80 volunteers and school staff were able to celebrate what has been achieved over 20 years. It was a joyous occasion celebrating many aspects of the project, but especially the fact that to date over 11 million meals have been supplied to children of the Garden Route.

The e'Pap feeding project was started in 2003 with the aim of feeding a pre-cooked porridge to pre-school children in Knysna. It was a very small initiative, just 60 children from two pre-schools were given the health generating breakfast each school day. The children were monitored and it was very clear that e'Pap made a big difference to their health, and so the project started to grow.



Twenty years on, the e'Pap Children's Feeding Project has expanded - reaching pre-schools in George, Sedgefield, Knysna and Plettenberg Bay. Over 5,500 children in some 140 pre-schools now receive regular meals of e'Pap.

Shelley Godsell said "Many of

our donors are from the Garden Route. Others are from other parts of our country and overseas - we thank them all. They have enabled us to feed and improve the health of a generation of children. On behalf of all these children, thank you, enkosi kakhulu and baie dankie.

ATM SAFETY

Please be vigilant at all times when making cash deposits or withdrawals at ATMs. Syndicates of fraudsters often stop in small towns in search of 'easy prey', focusing their attention on elderly folk using the ATMs on their own.

Safety tips when making cash withdrawals or deposits:

- Be very conscious of your surroundings.
- Don't share your bank trip plans with anyone you do not know well.
- Where possible, take someone with you to the ATM.
- Make sure no one has followed you after making a withdrawal.
- Don't speak to strangers, remember criminals will distract you before striking.
- Avoid exact routine - rather vary the date and time of trips to your local branch or nearest ATM.
- Try to avoid peak periods and standing in queues.
- Don't make cash withdrawals / deposits at night.
- Make your large cash deposits at an ATM in the nearest branch, where there are security guards.
- Don't make cash deposits or withdrawals if you feel unsafe.
- Make use of electronic banking to avoid going to branches or ATMs.
- If available, make use of cash withdrawal / deposit facilities at supermarket tills.

This wine's front label is very traditional and the back label indicates a fair amount of information about the typical Cape Red Blend (Pinotage, Merlot, Cabernet, Shiraz) The solid cork showed no form of leakage or deterioration, although the wine had lain down for quite a few years. The colour is dark and shows a brown rim in the glass, which indicates that it is an older wine. Interesting short legs. No flaws on the nose. Red plum, All Spice and Cloves were some of the aromas experienced. It is a very well balanced wine that covers the whole mouth. The red plums carry through from the nose to the mouth. Hints of walnut lead to a slight bitter taste. The Synergy has a long mouth feel. Nuances of the silver paper in a Van Rijn's cigarette box, walnuts and red plums



linger. The Wine Ghost was privileged to taste such an excellent wine, true to Beyerskloof, with a juicy piece of Sirloin steak! If cellared carefully, this wine will continue to develop in the bottle for up to ten years. The price range is between R120 and R140. **In Vino Veritas, till next time.**
