DIVARIS MAKES SAILING HISTORY

Last weekend saw Sedgefielder Georgou (Yogi) Divaris winning the Laser Yacht Racing National Championships in Langebaan. This victory, when combined with his 1st place at the 2026 Finn Yacht Racing National Championships in late March, has earned the local sailor a place in the record books, as the Double Win has not happened for decades - if ever!

The racing in Langebaan was top notch as the yachting aces came from cities and towns across the country including Johannesburg, Durban and Cape Town.

Six races were sailed in heavy wind conditions with the wind speeds being upward of 20 knots (40 km/h) and the waves having hectic chop. Divaris says it was "one of the toughest sails in a while and it was difficult to adjust to the boat". This is as Divaris has been sailing another type of yacht for a few months, namely the Finn. Divaris says "upwind was hard work into the chop and then fun surfing downwind". The reaches, which are crossways to the wind, "were fast!".

Divaris kicked off the regatta with a first place in race one, winning a total of four of the six races overall. His closest competition came from Alistair Keytel of Cape Town who won two of the six races.

The smaller Laser has a sail area of 7.1m², whilst that of the Finn is 10.7 m². The Finn was an Olympic Class from year 1952 to year 2020, whilst the Laser has been an Olympic Class from year 1996 to date.

Historians are combing the records to see if a South African sailor has ever won both the Finn and Laser National Championships in the same year, and the records show that this has certainly not happened in the last forty years. Well done Georgou Divaris, we are proud to have a multiple National Champion in Sedgefield.

According to Georgou, "The next big one is the Lipton Cup in August".

BATTEN DOWN THE HATCHES

The South African Weather Service has issued an Orange Level 8 weather warning of rainfall of between 150mm and 200mm forecast for today (Wednesday), raising the risk of flooding, damage to infrastructure and dangerous coastal conditions. Local schools in the Greater Knysna area are all closed for Wednesday and Thursday.

This warning, as well as a Yellow Level 4 warning for damaging winds and an Orange Level 6 warning for wind and waves are linked to an intense cut-off low pressure system across the Cape.

Residents are advised to brace for periods of intense downpours, slippery roads and significantly reduced visibility. Along the coastline, the Garden Route District Municipality has warned that such a system can whip up very rough to high seas, with waves in excess of 4-6 metres, posing a serious risk to small boats, shoreline activities and causing localised coastal erosion. Strong, gusty winds

over land also tend to accompany these systems, making driving difficult, especially for high-sided vehicles, and increasing the chance of falling branches, damaged roofs and sporadic power interruptions.

Garden Route Disaster Management has warned residents to treat such impact-based warnings as serious threats to both life and property, not just "bad weather". Authorities have highlighted risks including localised flooding of low-lying homes and informal settlements, rapid overland runoff where ground is already saturated, mudslides or rockfalls along steep cuttings, and temporary closure of smaller mountain passes and low-level river crossings. People are urged to clear gutters and street drains where safe, avoid unnecessary travel during peak rainfall and strongest winds, stay well back from riverbanks and beachfronts, and keep emergency numbers for the Garden Route Disaster Management Centre and local emergency services at hand for weather-related incidents. As this week's system moves in, residents should monitor updates from the South African Weather Service and Garden Route District Municipality throughout Wednesday and beyond, as warning levels may be upgraded if forecast rain, wind and waves intensify over the Sedgefield-Knysna coastline.

Meanwhile, Knysna Municipality has activated an integrated, multi-disciplinary response plan in anticipation of this severe weather

Knysna Executive Mayor Thando Matika confirmed that all municipal departments are on high alert and ready to respond. "Our priority is the safety of our residents and the protection of property and infrastructure. We urge communities to take these warnings seriously and to follow all official guidance," he said.

In line with council policy, plastic sheeting (gunplast) and sandbags will be issued to qualifying residents where a need for such assistance has been identified. Priority will be given to elderly and disabled residents living in informal settlements. Materials will be delivered to qualifying vulnerable properties in a timely manner.

"We remind residents in formal housing areas to ensure that their properties are ready for the potential rainstorm," Matika added. "Please clear the aprons around houses and dwellings from any obstructions that may lead to pooling or the flooding of water runoff. Do not hesitate to contact us for assistance in cases where the direct runoff from municipal systems threatens to flood your property."

All emergencies must be reported through official channels to ensure a coordinated and timely response. Emergencies can be reported via 044 302 8911 or WhatsApp 060 998 6969. Failure to use these official channels may result in delays or missed responses. "Households should remain indoors where possible, ensure drainage systems are

clear and functioning, keep pets safe and be prepared to move to higher ground if necessary," urged Matika.

"We will continue to monitor the situation closely and provide updates as conditions develop," he concluded. Please take this information on board, stay informed and act responsibly to help minimise the impact of this potentially severe weather event."

Ward 2 Councillor Cleone Vanston has organised the Sedgefield Town Hall to be opened on Wednesday night from 6pm as a night shelter for the homeless and street people.

SUSPECTED DOG POISONING

There was huge concern on Monday morning, when residents of Groenvallei woke to the news of a suspected poisoning of three dogs at a home on Fraser Street.

Owner Antonette Swanepoel says Bella, Sokkies and Bentley - all three rescue dogs with a good amount of mixed genetics - are used to sleeping in their shed outside, though that is something she is now going to change.

"The dogs started barking aggressively around 8pm, and then they were just suddenly quiet," she told us, "I did have a look out the window, but when I couldn't see anything out of the ordinary I presumed it had been a visiting cat that had set them off."

Early the following morning

she called them and heard scuffling in the shed, so thought the dogs were just too cozy to come out - which is often the case in winter.

She went about her usual morning routine, dropping the kids at school and doing chores, but when she went outside at about 9.30 she discovered all three of them were in a bad way, and had clearly been vomiting extensively.

"We are sure it was poisoning, though we don't know what was used," Antonette said, "We suspect it must have been a concoction because their symptoms were not all collectively linked to one sort of commonly used poison."

She explained that it wasn't just the dogs' digestive tracts that had been affected, their nervous systems had been attacked too. "They were having seizures and their heart rates were scarily low. They were also battling to breathe," she said.

Searching their property, the family couldn't find any indication of what had been used, but started to treat the dogs for poisoning.

Growing up on a farm Antonette had had experience of animals being poisoned, and knew what needed to be done in their current situation. After

getting confirmation from a vet, she immediately administered activated charcoal to their three much-loved hounds.

By the time we spoke to her on Tuesday morning, there were signs of improvement

"It was a bit touch and go late last night," she reported "But now they are all responsive and going outside for toilet breaks and to drink some water with stability assistance. They are still weak but at least have

started eating little bits of cooked chicken with the natural gelatin and steamed veggies, so are showing good signs of pulling through."

Better yet, their tails had started wagging when she spoke to them.

Though Antonette and her family are very relieved, they felt it important to warn others about the poisoning, just in case.

The Concept of Planetary Boundaries

The relatively new Planetary Boundaries Framework, introduced by Johan Rockström and colleagues in 2009, outlines nine key Earth system processes that support planetary stability. It defines limits to human activity to prevent severe environmental change and emphasises that these boundaries are interconnected, with transgressing one increasing pressure on others.

Nine Planetary Boundaries were identified in 2009:

1. Climate Change – we should limit atmospheric CO₂ to below 350 ppm.
2. Biosphere Integrity – we must maintain biodiversity with an extinction rate below 10 species per million per year. Currently > 100 extinctions per million species annually.
3. Land-System Change – Restricts cropland to less than 15% of arable land (excludes ice-over land).
4. Freshwater Use – Keeps consumptive use below 4,000 km³ per year globally.
5. Biogeochemical Flows – Control nitrogen fixation and phosphorus inflow to oceans (<10 times natural background).
6. Ocean Acidification – Maintains surface seawater saturation state with respect to aragonite (a carbonate mineral) at 80% of pre-industrial levels.
7. Atmospheric Aerosol Loading – Currently lacks a quantified boundary but affects climate and ecosystems.
8. Stratospheric Ozone Depletion – Limits reduction to <5% from pre-industrial levels.
9. Novel Entities (Chemical Pollution) – These boundaries are not yet fully quantified, includes plastics and synthetic chemicals.

According to Prof Barend Erasmus from GIBS, we have already exceeded the Planetary Boundaries for Climate Change, Biosphere Integrity and Novel entities (plastic and sewage pollution) in South Africa.

What is the status of our planetary boundaries?

The 2025 Planetary Health Check reports that seven of the nine boundaries have been transgressed: climate change, biosphere integrity, land-system change, freshwater use, biogeochemical flows, introduction of novel entities, and ocean acidification. Only atmospheric aerosol loading and stratospheric ozone depletion remain within the safe operating space. Crossing these boundaries increases the risk of large-scale environmental disruptions, which may not be immediate but can have long-term consequences for human wellbeing and ecosystems.

Rockström emphasises that humanity is now the primary driver of planetary change, and urgent, transformative action is required to maintain Earth in the current, or Holocene-like, state. Some scientists argue that humanity has already moved out of the Holocene state into a new Anthropocene state. The Holocene epoch began approximately 11,700 years ago and is characterised by a relatively stable climate, which has allowed the development of agriculture and urban societies. In contrast, the Anthropocene, acknowledges the profound influence of human actions on the Earth's environment, leading to a much hotter and less stable climate.

The Planetary Boundary Framework supports sustainable development, policymaking, and global governance by defining a safe operating space for humanity. It emphasises the need for equitable, science-based actions and integrated strategies across all boundaries to ensure long-term planetary resilience.

Conclusion

The planetary boundaries framework provides a quantitative and systemic approach to understanding human impacts on Earth. By

respecting these nine boundaries, we can aim to maintain not only a stable and resilient planet but also ensure the continued viability of ecosystems and human wellbeing in our society. Rockström's work remains central to global sustainability science, policy guidance, and the ongoing assessment of planetary health.

To influence planetary boundaries, each one of us can engage in activities that promote sustainable practices and reduce human impact on the Earth's systems. Here are some ways to influence planetary boundaries:

1. Reduce greenhouse gas emissions: Implement renewable energy sources, energy-efficient technologies, and reduce your reliance on fossil fuels to lower carbon dioxide levels in the atmosphere.
2. Conservation of biodiversity: Protect and restore our natural habitats and support conservation efforts to preserve species and ecosystems.
3. Water management: Implement water-saving technologies, manage water resources sustainably, capture rainwater and help ensure access to clean water for all.
4. Land use practices: Adopt sustainable land use practices, such as agroforestry that deliberately integrates trees and shrubs with crops and/or livestock to create sustainable, productive, and ecologically diverse agricultural landscapes to prevent soil degradation and maintain land health. Promote sustainable urban development.
5. Circular economy: Promote a circular economy by reducing waste. Recycle, and reuse materials to minimise the need for added resources. Use your organic waste for composting and mulch in your garden.
6. Talk about it, share your experience, and hold politicians and unscrupulous developers responsible for their actions.

By taking these actions, individuals can contribute to the preservation of Earth's systems and help maintain a safe operating space for humanity. **Think globally, act locally.**

WOLK, ZEELIE AND WESTON CROWNED 2026 SIMOLA HILLCLIMB KING OF THE HILL CHAMPS

The 16th edition of the Simola Hillclimb delivered an exceptional showcase of performance, energy and excitement, with the 2026 King of the Hill champions crowned after two intense days of competition.

Robert Wolk was the class winner of the Single Seater, Sports Car and Sports Prototypes field, scoring his second King of the Hill title with his best run of the weekend in the all-or-nothing Top 10 Shootout of 35.024 seconds. He recorded an average speed of 195.295 km/h in the Investchem team's 2005 Gould Gr55.

Wolk said, "Unfortunately, we didn't break the 35-second mark which was our goal for the weekend, but we made progress throughout the two days.

Ian Schofield was the runner-up in his 2014 Mygale Formula Ford

Modified Saloon Cars

In the highly anticipated King of the Hill battle for Modified Saloon Cars, Pieter Zeelie secured his status as one of the Simola Hillclimb legends with his third win – and his second in a row – in the mighty 2002 Toyota MR2. His winning time of 37.216 seconds was a mere 0.126 sec off his class record from last year (37.090 sec).

Five-time winner Franco Scribante set the second-fastest time in the Top 10 Shootout of

38.317 seconds, but his run was disqualified after hitting a track limits marker at the top of the 1.9 km Simola Hill course. Silvio Scribante led numerous sessions throughout the weekend in his bright yellow 2006 Audi RS3, known as Pacman, having done a huge amount of work on the car since last year. Steve Clark claimed the final step of the Modified Saloon Car podium in his 2000 Nissan Skyline R34 GT-R (39.827 seconds).

Road Cars and Supercars

Clint Weston dominated every session he competed in throughout this year's event, driving the 2025 Mercedes-AMG GT 63 S E Performance. After winning the 2025 Road Car and Supercar King of the Hill title in a similar car last year, he not only powered his way to a second consecutive victory, but set an exceptional new overall class record in the process during the Class Finals of 42.527 seconds, achieving a standing start average speed of 160.839 km/h.

Cristiano Verolini finished runner-up in the 2026 BMW M4, with his best run of the weekend in the final shootout of 44.099 seconds. German BMW factory racing driver Jens



Hillclimb victor Robert Wolk recorded an average speed of 195.295 km/h in the Investchem team's 2005 Gould GR55.

Klingmann ended on the standard production car podium in the 2026 BMW M5, having also set his fastest time of 44.893 seconds in the all-or-nothing Top 10 Shootout.

This year's Simola Hillclimb was also the first attended in person by Rodrigo de Oliveira, the Portugal-based founder of the immensely popular and successful Hillclimb Monsters channels on YouTube and social media. He has been a key part of the commentary team for many years – albeit remotely from home, so it was fantastic to have him at the event in 2026.

"The Simola Hillclimb has massive potential to go beyond what we've already seen, with

lots of interest from more international competitors. I hope to be a cog in this machine, taking it to the next level for people outside of this country, and serving as a megaphone for the event and South Africa," he said.

When Coalitions Crumble, Communities Pay the Price

In recent years, the phrase "coalition government" has become part of everyday conversation in South Africa. Yet for many, its true meaning, and its impact, remains unclear.

Simply put, a coalition government is formed when no single political party wins an outright majority. Parties are then forced to work together to govern. In theory, this can be healthy for democracy, encouraging cooperation and balance. In practice, however, it often leads to instability. Agreements are fragile, priorities clash, and leadership can change hands frequently. The result? Decisions are delayed, accountability becomes blurred, and service delivery suffers.

For ordinary citizens, coalition instability is not a political concept. It is a lived reality.

It shows up in the potholes that remain unrepaired. In the taps that run dry. In electricity outages that stretch from inconvenience into hardship. It's seen in infrastructure left to decay while leaders argue behind closed doors. When those tasked with governing are preoccupied with maintaining power rather than serving people, communities are left behind.

There is also a deeper frustration, one that many feel but seldom express openly. It's the weariness of watching the same patterns repeat. Promises made with confidence before elections, only to dissolve into excuses afterwards. Corruption allegations that spark outrage,

then quietly fade without consequence. Over time, this erodes not just infrastructure, but trust.

And so, many of us cope the only way we know how: by disengaging. We turn away from the news. We avoid the conversations. We tell ourselves it's all too complicated, too frustrating, too far beyond our control.

But in doing so, we risk becoming like the proverbial ostrich with its head in the sand. The ostrich does not see the danger, but the danger remains. Ignoring the problem does not make it disappear. It merely removes it from view while it continues to grow.

This is where voter education becomes critical.

Elections are not just about hope; they are about responsibility. Each vote is a decision that shapes the direction of our communities and our country. And yet, too often, decisions are based on promises rather than performance.

It is worth asking: what has

changed since the last election? Have services improved? Has infrastructure been maintained? The answer a resounding, "No!". Has corruption been addressed, or simply renamed and repackaged?

If the same choices are made, we should not be surprised by the same results.

This is not a call to cynicism, but to awareness. Not a rejection of democracy, but an appeal to strengthen it. Voting is one of the most powerful tools we have, but only if it is used wisely.

As citizens, we owe it to ourselves and to future generations to look beyond slogans and manifestos. To ask difficult questions. To hold leaders accountable, not just for what they promise, but for what they have done.

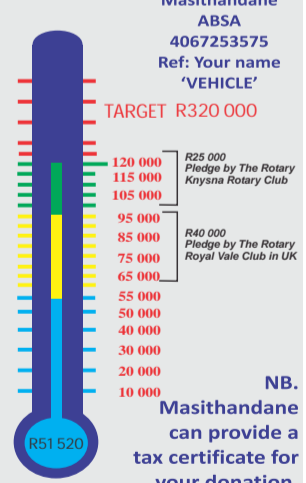
Because at the end of the day, the quality of our governance is not only a reflection of those elected, but of the choices we make at the ballot box.

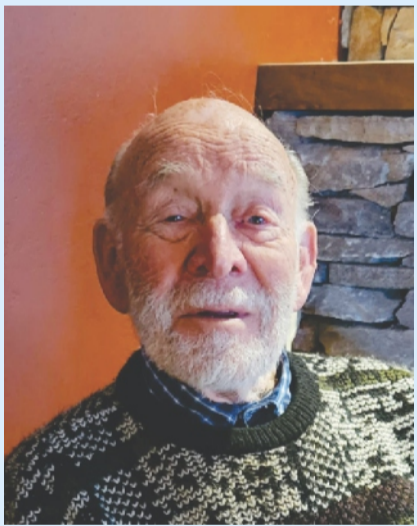

APPOINTMENT DISAPPOINTMENT

At a council meeting held in chambers on 30 April, Boy Manqoba Ngubo was appointed as the Acting Municipal Manager for Knysna Municipality.

Two names were put forward - the other being Johnny Douglas, the current Director of Community Services, but a split vote found Ngubo being selected

by the council majority

Sedgfield's Ward One councillor Levael Davis is clearly not happy with this decision, and has issued the following statement.

"The ANC coalition councillors through their majority appointed an external individual to act as Municipal Manager for a period of three months. While the law allows for various acting appointments, it is important to remember that such short-term measures are intended to stabilise administration in a cost-effective and compliant manner.

In most cases, this is best achieved by appointing a suitably qualified internal senior official who already understands the municipality's systems, budget cycles, performance targets, and service delivery obligations. This approach not only ensures continuity but also aligns with financial prudence by avoiding the higher costs associated with external appointments.

"This (30 April) decision raises important governance considerations. For a short three-month period, bringing in an external appointee may introduce unnecessary costs, potential compliance risks, and delays in operational effectiveness, particularly where capable internal candidates exist. It is also concerning that certain questions regarding the candidate's history and credibility remained unanswered.

The DA are firm believers in the fact that every decision taken must reflect the political leaderships' commitment to responsible governance, financial sustainability, and the best interests of our community. Acting appointments should prioritise stability, value for money, and institutional continuity which are principles that are essential if we are serious about delivering effective and accountable local government.

When those principles are not clearly reflected, it leaves one with a sense of what can only be described as an appointment disappointment.

WHAT HAPPENS TO A PROPERTY WITH A BOND WHEN SOMEONE PASSES AWAY?

An outstanding bond is treated like any other debt in a deceased estate and must be settled first.

The estate is responsible for settling all debts and expenses first. This includes the home loan, vehicle repayments, credit cards and other outstanding accounts. If the estate does not have enough cash to settle the liabilities, assets may need to be sold. Where a property is left to an heir, they must decide whether they can pay the bond in full. If not, the property will need to be sold to settle the debt. Only once all debts and expenses are paid can the estate be distributed. A property cannot be transferred while a bond remains in the deceased's name, unless a new bond is approved in the heir's name.

SA National Burn Safety Awareness Week

The National Burns Association of South Africa (NBASA) has some important information to share on burns awareness and safety.

Burns awareness and safety at home.

- Have working smoke alarms in your home
- Have an ESCAPE plan
- Use quick release devices on security-barred windows
- Learn at least two escape routes/emergency exits from each room.

Arm yourself with knowledge

- Use the correct equipment (fire extinguishers in the kitchen, etc.)
- Keep Burnshield products for burns
- Call 10177 for help in a fire situation or 112 on a cell phone.

Hot water or liquids can cause burns

- Adjust the temperature of the geyser to 55°C
- When cooking with oil, have a lid nearby that can be

quickly placed over any oil it ignites. A wet cloth or baking powder can also be used to smother the flames.

- Never throw water onto burning oil, it can spread the fire and also cause an explosion.
- Have a fire extinguisher and a fire blanket available in the kitchen.

Electricity can cause fires or burns.

- Do not overload electrical circuits, especially extension cords
- Supplying other properties or buildings with electricity by using long extensions, especially if they cross streets, can lead to electrocution and fire
- Never use electrical appliances with wet hands, in the bathroom or pool, as water conducts electricity
- Always unplug heat-producing appliances when not in use, especially irons and heaters
- A heater must be at least 1m away from anything that may catch fire (clothing, furniture or curtains). DO NOT dry clothes on a heater.

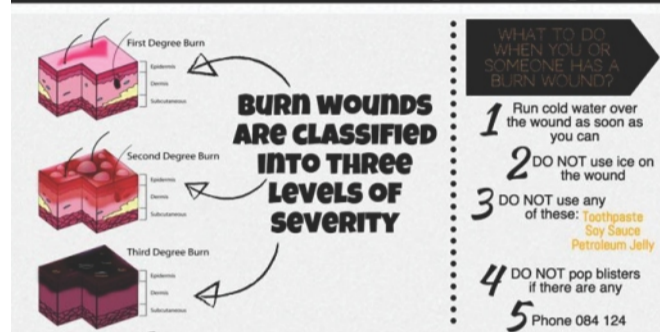

"Furthermore, there will be no fee charged for camping on their beautiful grounds - an established, tree-filled area within sight and sound of the Indian Ocean. Campsites have easy access to excellent ablutions and the ATKV Amphitheatre, where a range of speakers will inspire men to live out their faith boldly," says Swart.

'Arise' is the theme selected for this year's Mighty Men Mossel Bay Conference, calling on men to step into their roles as prophets, priests, and kings in every sphere of life. Arise is God's call to men

who have been sitting too long. Throughout the Bible, when God says arise, it's usually directed at someone who is:

- Discouraged
- Stuck
- Afraid, or
- Carrying a burden

And then God interrupts that state. "Arise, shine, for your light has come..." (Isaiah 60:1). "This isn't a suggestion, it's a command tied to identity, 'a call to action for men to lead with integrity and faith, positively impacting their families, workplaces, and communities'. Here is our message to the men:

- You can't live off yesterday's faith, your father's faith, or someone else's calling. God is calling you to stand up and lead.
- Your mistakes don't disqualify you. Staying down does.
- It's not too late. You're not too far gone. You're not too old; God is still calling you forward."

When delving into the history of the national Mighty Men movement, its rapid growth over the past 22 years is a significant factor. Founded in 2004 by author and evangelist Angus Buchan, it was inspired by his desire to mentor men to be godly leaders - a concept stemming from the 'mighty men' of King David.

Followers attending gatherings under Buchan's Shalom Trust umbrella grew from around 240 men in 2004 to over 60,000 in 2008 - and hundreds of thousands by 2010. Core messages shared at these conferences include repentance, repairing family relationships, and reclaiming the role of men as spiritual leaders in their homes.

And the great outdoors has always been part of the plan. Explains Swart: "These are non-denominational outdoor camping events, often in rural settings and characterised by a rustic, informal atmosphere. ATKV Hartenbos is perfect for this purpose.

"The original Shalom Trust national events ended in 2010, but smaller, independent Mighty Men events continue to take place across South Africa." Swart adds that the early conferences

were highlighted in the film and book Faith Like Potatoes.

This exposure significantly impacted many potential attendees, particularly among Afrikaans-speaking men, by promoting a message of faith and accountability in a time when South Africans experienced a particularly challenging social landscape.

The Wine Ghost

The Wine Ghost tasted - Van Loveren Moscato (Perlé Rosé)

The bottle has a rather plain front label, but somehow, the pink lettering catches one's attention. WG could not find a year of production. Abv. - 10%.

Lower alcohol in the wine is typical of a perlé. On the back label there are tasting notes and once again the emblem of a vegan friendly wine. Interestingly, the vegan practise is becoming more and more common in wine production.

This moscato has a light peach colour, with lots of small bubbles and legs in the glass. The nose is clean, with aromas of rose petals, Turkish delight, raspberry milkshake and far off in the background, dried sweet basil leaves.

It is a very well balanced wine, with flavours of strawberry fizzers and Turkish delight. It has a medium to short mouth feel with tastes of Turkish delight and slight minerality left in the mouth.

WG sees this as a very nice, fizzy wine to enjoy with spicy food, summer salad, or on its own, sipping slowly while contemplating the good in life!

It is a good find in the price range R60- R80.

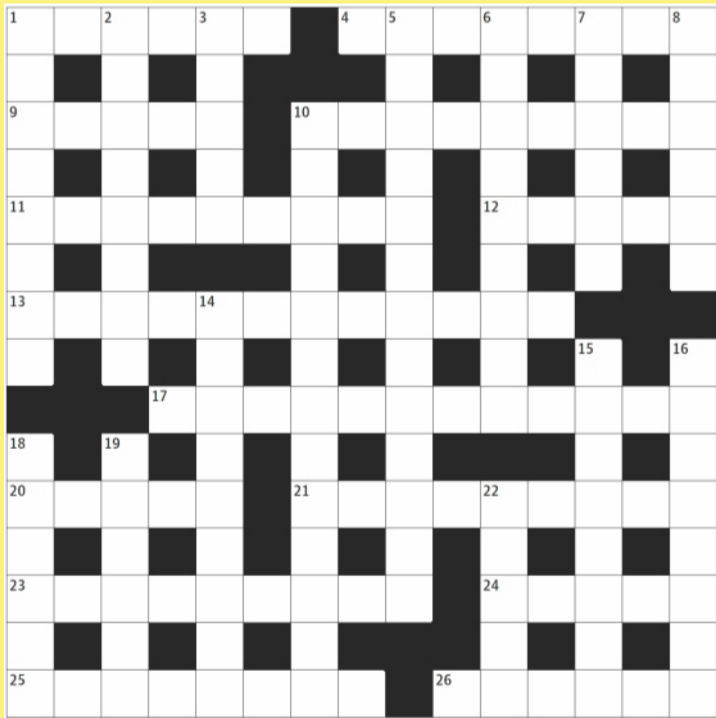

Elia Meyer secured a Bronze medal in a highly competitive division, achieving this as the smallest competitor — a remarkable display of courage and determination.

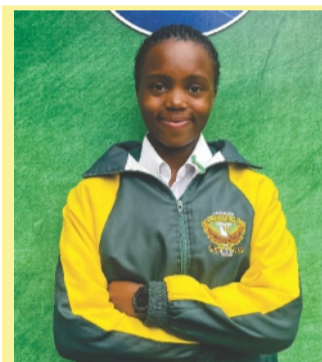
Special mention must be made of the junior fighters — Elia, Joshua, and Nicolas — who conducted themselves with maturity beyond their years.
